Newcastle Diocese was one of the first to adopt Mothers' Union, shortly after the Diocese was formed in 1882. The first President of MU in Newcastle Diocese was Mrs Emily Wilberforce, wife of the first Bishop of Newcastle, Rt Revd Ernest Wilberforce.
