**<u>Bible Reading:</u>** Matthew 23: 1-12 read by Barbara Jennings

#### A Reflection from Veronica Wilson

It's a tough week for the preacher this week... 23: v 3 `...for they do not practise what they preach'!

Jesus in this part of Matthew's gospel was talking to the crowds and the disciples about the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, whose teaching was good, and should be listened to, but in their lives and in the expectations they laid on their listeners they did not do so well. Their deeds did not match their words. Jesus is challenging their false living, their love of status, position and privilege.

He contrasts those who love to be noticed for their 'acts of righteousness' with those who humbly and quietly serve... In Jesus' radical kingdom, it's the servants who will be exalted, the humble who will be lifted up. In many ways that sounds not too hard, but the reality is it can be difficult, not to blow our own trumpets, it's tough when what we do is not seemed to be noticed or appreciated.

Today's reading underlines the importance of not being hypocritical, making sure that what we do, matches what we say and what we believe... it's about integrity and being real, being true to ourselves and to God...living as Jesus did with a down to earth holiness.

So actually I don't thinks it's just a tough week for me, the preacher, it's a challenge for us all, to be people of faith, who live with integrity, whose faith shows in what we say and what we do, whose faith builds others up not adds burdens onto them (remember Jesus said 'my yoke is easy and my burden is light') whose faith does not judge but accepts and loves, as Jesus loves and serves. Whose faith is seen through how we live our lives.

We only need to look back to the preceding chapter of Matthew's gospel to be reminded of the greatest commandment, the basic tenent of the kingdom of God (which the Pharisees and teachers of the law were teaching) — `Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. Love your neighbour as yourself'.

Maybe as we seek to live lives of integrity this week, we could meditate on these words of Jesus and see what they lead us to say and do in the coming days-

### A prayer to finish:

Lord, grant me:

courage to speak the truth when it is uncomfortable; grace to live quietly when I would like to be noticed; perseverance to do ordinary tasks well, rather than to seek glory in the spectacular;

confidence to entrust my strengths and weaknesses to you; integrity to pray as I can, not as I think I ought to; and the joy of knowing that no praise, no privilege, no position matter more than being surrounded by your love and faithfulness every day. Amen.

We thank you God for this last supper which your son instigated, we are reminded of how much you love us and of the sacrifice that your Son made so that we could worship you freely and thank you for all you have done and all you have given us, so help us in return to give our all to you, in the name of Christ.

### Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Eternal God, we come to you on this day of All Saints as ordinary everyday people, nothing special about us and no particular merits to boast of, yet you have called us to be part of your family, you have called us to be your church and today you have called us to remember all who have gone ahead of us in the journey of faith. Merciful God give us the grace to follow in the footsteps of the saints, as they followed in the footsteps of your dear son. Keep alive the memory of those dear to ourselves whom you have called to yourself (Short silence). Grant that every remembrance --which turns our hearts from things seen, to things unseen may lead us always upwards to you until we come to eternal rest. We thank you Lord for the example of all the saints and as we go from here into the world helps us to follow in their footsteps with courage and hope determined like them, to do your work and live the Gospel of your son. Lastly, in the words of St Francis' prayer:

Make us instruments of your peace. Where there is hatred, let us sow love. Where there is injury, pardon. Where there is doubt, faith. Where there is despair, hope. Where there is darkness, light. Where there is sadness, joy. May we not so much seek to be consoled as to console, not so much to be understood as to understand, not so much to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we awake to eternal life.

Merciful Father accept these prayers for the sake of your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ.
