Wycombe Women's Aid

Christmas is a time of great joy and celebration, but for many women and children the holidays and associated financial strain mean it is a time of added risk if they are living in a household with domestic abuse. For this reason, Wycombe Women's Aid has been chosen as the charity for our support in January.

Wycombe Women's Aid is a registered charity working in the Wycombe, South Bucks and Chiltern Districts of Buckinghamshire. It works with women and children experiencing or trying to escape domestic violence. It offers access to safe, temporary accommodation, support, information and advice to all women.

It enables women and children to live free from fear and to build safe and healthy lives. Your contribution will help to change lives.

Please give generously – donations directly benefit those being helped.

The charity offers:

Refuge - a confidential safe house where women and children can go if they are escaping domestic violence, with employee support.

Children and Youth Support - it has a dedicated children and youth service to meet the emotional, physical and educational needs of all the children and young people living in the refuge or in the local community.

Outreach - this service is free of charge, to help women living in the High Wycombe, South Bucks and Chiltern Districts of Buckinghamshire.

Counselling - this service is free, where the counsellor and client meet in a private, safe and confidential setting to explore the situation.

Independent Domestic Violence Advocacy - IDVAs provide crisis support and information for high or medium cases of domestic violence. They offer information and support on various subjects.

One Can update

One Can Trust are facing a monumental task for the next few months.

The perceived 'typical' client of the food bank is now changing dramatically as more people are made redundant. One Can is conscious of people's reticence because of shame, fear or sense of failure. They are determined to help everyone who needs help even short term. The referral process is straightforward and quick, so that families can benefit immediately.

If you know anyone who could do with a helping hand, then do get in touch with them. All details below. Alternatively, do chat in confidence to Cassa or Janna who are able to refer.

On average in October, One Can delivered food parcels for 452 people; 215 were children.

This represents a 101% increase over March's figures of 225 people per week.

I am still collecting and dropping off to the warehouse every Friday morning. The container is at the back of our house, 5 Coat Wicks. There is still a drop off point at Best One too.

The charity is not looking for Christmas items as the hampers have already been distributed, but if you can help with any of the items listed, it would be much appreciated as the crisis continues. They have some families who have food intolerances, so please consider donating some 'Free from' products if you possibly can.

Once again, Thank you Seer Green for your continued commitment. Little did I think in March that I would still be doing this in November.

Things to plant in December

- Garlic can still be planted out in December.
- Aquadulce broad beans can also be planted for a juicy spring harvest.
- Onion and shallot sets can be planted from now until mid-March.

Winter tips for houseplants

- Some indoor plants need less water over the winter.
- Succulents only need watering every 3 weeks.

- You can stop watering cacti for a couple of months (as long as they have had a good water first).
- With fewer daylight hours some plants could be moved to a brighter spot.
- Don't let your plants get too hot or too cold, keep them away from draughty windows and extreme heat from central heating.
- Inspect your indoor plants for pests such as aphids, thrips, mealybugs and scale insects.
- Keep leaves free from dust, give them a wipe over with a damp cloth.

Recycling festive gift wrap

Christmas is coming with lots of beautifully wrapped gifts ... but how to handle the waste afterwards, and are there natural alternatives?

According to Bucks County Council, "Not all wrapping paper can be recycled or composted. Some wrapping paper contains metal content plus there is the issue of sticky tape, glitter and foil back paper. If it is just paper then it can be recycled. Wrapping paper made out of paper will be white in the middle when torn." Bucks CC told me verbally that this also applies to gift tissue - as long as it's not sparkly, it can be recycled.

Alternatives to the high street shops include FSC certified, recyclable paper from the RSPB, www.shopping.rspb.org.uk/christmasgift-wrap Traidcraft.co.uk also has ethically made paper but its gold trim may not meet Bucks CC's requirements. Other options include decorating brown paper with waterbased markers or stamps, or reusing newspaper, which looks smart if done well.

Remember to tear off sellotape before recycling; paper tape (despite touted biodegradability) may not be recyclable so be safe, remove it ... or avoid the hassle, wrap without using adhesives.



Standard gift ribbon is made from plastic; natural alternatives include cotton, jute, hemp or wool string which can be home composted. A sprig of holly or pine tucked into the bow adds a special touch. Woven cloth ribbon usually contains polyester; save it for reuse next year as it won't compost.


Gift bags, tags and cards follow the same principles: plain paper or card can be recycled but shiny material, adhesives and non-organic ties must be removed and put in general waste.

An increasingly popular trend is wrapping gifts in fabric or scarves, thus avoiding adhesives or ribbon; these can be reused next year, put into textile recycling containers or donated to charity shops as appropriate. Upscale options include www.fabricwrappingco.com/, www.happywrap.co.uk and more.

Which child doesn't like to draw?


Rob Biddulph has put an instructional video on social media every day during lockdown #DrawWlthRob.



Bus service

Carousel's route 104 now provides an hourly service Monday to Friday from Seer Green to Beaconsfield (Maxwell Rd) and on to High Wycombe. The service runs from 07.09 am till 20.03 (in the middle of the day it is 46 minutes past each hour). There is a similar service on Saturdays (midday times 06 past the hour). Return times typically give one just over an hour (or more) in Beaconsfield.



The Red Eagle route 380 provides one service, on Tuesdays and Fridays only, from Jordans to Beaconsfield (Waitrose) and on to Loudwater (Tesco superstore) leaving Jordans at 10.10. The return bus allows 1 hour and 40 minutes in Beaconsfield (only 15 mins at Loudwater).

Carousel does provide hourly services for most of the day between Beaconsfield and Amersham (route 103) and between Chalfont St Giles and Amersham (route 105) but in neither case are there convenient connections with our 104 service. The best thing would be to take the 104 bus into Beaconsfield (Maxwell Rd) and wait there, around half an hour, for the Amersham bus (which goes on to Rickmansworth and Watford).

Tweet of the Month: 'Nightly Sings the Staring Owl'

As autumn nights draw in and thoughts turn to Christmas ghost stories, the Tawny Owl provides the perfect sound-track. Also known as the 'brown owl', strix aluco is found in wooded areas across mainland GB, though it's absent from Ireland.

Hunting nocturnally from a tree branch perch, its acute hearing helps it capture mice, voles, birds, insects, fish, worms, rabbits - and squirrels! Who can forget the irascible Old Mr Brown in Beatrix Potter's Tale of Squirrel Nutkin, who (spoiler alert) bites off Nutkin's tail.

Young tawnies are fed by their parents for several months after leaving the nest, as in the picture book Owl Babies, but come autumn they must disperse to seek their own territories.

'Nightly sings the staring owl, to-whit, to-who,' according to Shakespeare; but it's really two separate sounds: 'to-wit' (or 'kewick') and the male's long, wavering 'too-hoo-ooo-ooo', often delivered as he defends his patch from this year's questing youngsters.



It's not unusual to hear tawnies in and around Seer Green and Jordans, but twice recently I spotted them. About an hour after sunset, in mid October, harsh 'kewick' calls from a tree in Green Meadow were followed by a shadow floating high across School Road and a few more calls from the woods near the war memorial.

A week later, in the lane by Hall Place, I was startled by a loud 'too -hoo-ooo-ooo', repeated several times from an ash tree. In the light of the waxing moon, a slight bulge in one of the branches resolved into an owl with outstretched wings, silently vanishing over the rooftops.

The British Trust for Ornithology estimates the UK has 50,000 nesting pairs, but numbers are dropping and tawnies are now Amber Listed. For more information including occasional 'citizen science' projects see: www.bto.org/our-science/projects/project-owl/learn-about-owls/tawny-owl.


