Dan's licensing service will take place on **Thursday 27 January** at 7.30pm in Chalfont St Giles.


We very much look forward to working with Dan next year and to starting the process to recruit a 'house for duty' vicar for Seer Green and Jordans.

Charity for January - WaterAid

Water Aid say 'Clean water, decent toilets and good hygiene are basic human rights.

Water changes everything

For Fatima, Lourdes and Amelia in Timor-Leste, that means being able to drink from the tap without worrying about deadly diseases.

Decent toilets

1.7 billion people, more than one in five do not have a decent toilet of their own. Not having a toilet is dangerous. 'It means there's nowhere



to treat or manage human waste properly, so germs get into water sources and food, spreading diseases like diarrhoea and cholera. It means people having to go to the loo outside, which is especially unsafe for women and children. And it means people stop going to work and school if they are poorly, or on their period.'

Good hygiene saves lives

To make the benefits of clean water last for generations, good hygiene is the key. Hygiene covers many behaviours from personal handwashing to clean use of toilets and safe use of water. Some groups of people are more affected by poor hygiene, especially people with disabilities, young girls, women and babies.

Why do WaterAid talk about periods? In many countries periods are still a huge taboo, meaning girls never learn how to manage them properly, and schools lack decent toilets and washing facilities, leading to many girls missing class when they have their period.

Brenda Nduta 13 is a student and senior member of the health club. She teaches her peers about sanitary napkins and handwashing practices at Kangemi primary school, Nairobi.

Christmas with a difference (again)


Christingle - 10am Sunday 5 December








Jordans resident who combined genetic science with a passion for birds



My father, Nowell Stebbing was a resident of Jordans until he passed away last December. During his last years he was writing a book, combining his great professional expertise in genetic science and his personal passion for birds and bird watching. He left behind a well-edited first draft and lots of manuscripts and notes for the final version, which I am proud to say have been lovingly combined and manipulated into the magnificent printed book, available now. Evolution is a tour-de-force by a man who was absolutely a master of his subject. It allows the reader to understand the process and causes of Evolution, from the basic science

of genetics and generation, and uses the magnificent variance of bird life to exemplify the process. At nearly 450 pages its is not for the faint hearted, but for the interested reader I promise that it will be thoroughly rewarding.

Hazelnut & Orange Biscotti

This Italian classic is perfect at Christmas served with coffee, hot chocolate or even mulled wine. Alternatively, biscotti makes a lovely present placed in a cellophane bag and tied with a festive ribbon. *Makes 40*.

Ingredients

- · 250g plain flour
- 150g caster sugar
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- · Pinch of salt
- 50g chilled butter, cubed
- 150g shelled hazelnuts, roughly chopped
- · 2 eggs (large)
- · Zest of an orange
- Extra caster sugar



Method

Preheat the oven to 180°C Fan. Sieve the flour into a large bowl and add the sugar, baking powder and a pinch salt. Using your fingers, rub the butter into the flour until it resembles breadcrumbs. Add the hazelnuts to the flour mixture together with the eggs and orange zest, then stir to form a stiff dough.

Divide the dough into two portions and shape each half into a log shape pproximately 20cm long. Then place on a greaseproof paper lined baking tray and flatten slightly. Dust with extra caster sugar and bake for 20-25 minutes or until golden. Remove from the oven and cool for 20 minutes.

Reduce the oven temperature to 160°C.


Cut each baked log into 5mm-1cm slices and spread over two baking trays.

Return to the oven for a further 20-25 minutes or until they begin to colour.

Cool completely and store in an airtight container.

Christmas family games

Dance Pong

You Need:

- 2 rectangular boxes with a large opening like a tissue box
- Some ping pong balls (between 10 and 16)
- Some string or ribbons (enough to be able to tie around a person's waist)
- Dance tunes

Ahead of the game attach ribbons or string either side of the boxes so that they can be tied around a person's waist with the box at the back.

Choose 2 people and tie the boxes onto their waist with the boxes at the back and the opening of the tissue box facing out. The bottom of the tissue box should be directly against the back of the person.

Fill each box with the same amount of ping pong balls, put the dance music on and the players have to shake the ping pong balls out of the tissue box using their amazing Dance moves! The winner is the first to achieve this.

The Malteser Game

- a) You Need:
- · A metal or plastic tape measure
- · A supply of Maltesers

One person holds a tape dispenser with the tape extended (decide

on a length to start and increase the difficulty if needed) and puts a Malteser onto the tape. They give the Malteser a nudge, while someone else holds the end of the tape to their lips and crouches to give the tape a downward tilt – both try to hold the tape steady as the ball of chocolate travels moving towards its target.

Put a handful of Maltesers into one side of each egg box. Give one egg box and one paper straw to each person. When you say go the players have to move each Malteser from one side of the egg box to the other by sucking it up with the straw until they have all been moved. Any Maltesers that are dropped outside of the egg box go back into the original side. The game is won when the first person gets all the Maltesers into the second side of the box.

What Am I Saying Game

You Need:

 A pair of noise cancelling headphones and music.

One person wears the headphones and listens to music whilst another sits facing them and clearly but quietly enunciates a message. The person with the headphones on repeats what they think is being said, usually causing much hilarity!

Swap players when the message has been deciphered or when the player gives up!



Christmas Stocking Game

You Need:

 A large sock or knitted stocking per team or just one if there's not many of you.

Ahead of the game find interesting small objects of different shape and material to fill the sock. Obviously nothing sharp!

Each team member or person feels the sock and writes down what they think the contents are. It's best to restrict the time they have to feel all the objects.

The contents are then revealed and the team or person with the most correct wins the game.

Tweet of the Month for December

Christmas gift shortage for Jays

Headlines lately have been full of shortages - fuel, HGV drivers, shipping containers, farm workers, building materials, and - the horror! - Christmas toys. This year, even birds have supply chain problems.

The Eurasian Jay is a member of the corvid family - as clever as its cousins the Crow and Rook, though more glamorous in pink, black and white with a blue wing patch. Its Welsh name, ysgrech y coed, means 'shrieker of the woods': it doesn't suffer humans gladly and its harsh alarm call often signals its presence just in time to see a flash of white as it disappears.

Like other corvids, it takes a mixed diet, but the clue to its favourite dish is its Latin name, *Garrulus glandarius*, 'chatty acorn gatherer'. With a memory like a London cabbie, it can recall thousands of acorn burial locations, but those that aren't retrieved over winter sprout into seedlings, and the Jay is a key part of the oak's life cycle.

Readers may recall that in autumn 2020, the ground was so thick with acorns they crunched underfoot like beach shingle. It was a 'mast year', a glorious glut for Jays and squirrels.

This year the opposite is the case. An unusually cold spring, combined with the fourth heaviest May rainfall on record, meant the oaks didn't blossom and set fruit the way they did in 2020.

Short shrift then for the Jays, but the bright side is this shy bird may visit our garden peanut feeders more frequently this winter. The birder who took the accompanying image recommends enlarging a few holes in the mesh to make it easier for it to feed... of course that might also make it easier for squirrels!
