

During this holiday, we went to Overbecks, a National Trust property which overlooks the Salcombe estuary and boasts sub-tropical gardens and unusual plants from all round the globe. As I visited with a 6 and 2-year-old, we enjoyed doing their children's activity pack as we wandered round. At the end of our visit the boys were given a prize for taking part in the activities: a packet of seeds. The National Trust volunteer said that they were palm seeds, which she said, "can take up to 12 months to start to grow!"

I don't know about you, but I'm not sure my patience is that good. I struggle keeping my 'spud in a bucket' alive for 7 months, and at least I can see it growing - but to invest in keeping something alive for a year, without seeing any evidence of its growth, seemed rather challenging for me as an adult, let alone expecting a 6-year-old to manage it. However, that said, the children excitedly took the seeds and will plant them at home. I'll wait patiently to see if anything starts to grow by next summer.

Together with partners, UNHCR is committed to staying and delivering amidst the deteriorating situation and growing displacement. The initial emergency response is to protect the most vulnerable and assist newly displaced Afghans with life-saving shelter, food, water, and core relief items, both within Afghanistan and in neighbouring countries.

- Divide mature rhubarb crowns to create new plants.
- Plant shallots, onions and garlic now for bigger bulbs next year.
- · Cut raspberry canes down to the ground when they finish fruiting.
- · Harvest guashes, pumpkins and tomatoes before first frosts.



When Lydia's body is pulled from the lake, the family shatters.

It's not easy being brought up in Ohio in 1970's with a Chinese father and blonde 'all American girl' mother with all their hopes and dreams depending on you.

Each sibling has their story to tell, Nathan, the older brother desperate to get away to college and Hannah, the youngest daughter, ignored by her parents but watchful of everything and then of course, Lydia struggling to be everything to everyone, but most of all, to fit in.

The first novel by the author of Little Fires Everywhere, is crafted perfectly, covering issues with a sense of sensitivity, calm and insight rather than hysteria and shock tactics.


Issues of racial tension are at the forefront, but the parents' high expectations and overwhelming love for their children show a careless cruelty.

This is a wonderfully perceptive, beautifully written novel.

Believe Me – JP Delaney

Wow – this is a great psychological thriller! Packed full of twists and turns, you genuinely don't know who to trust.

All Claire has ever wanted is to be an actor. A British girl in New York, unable to get a green card, she gets work entrapping straying husbands, using her acting skills to reel them in.



Her life changes when she meets Patrick, an academic, obsessed with the work of the sadomasochistic French poet Baudelaire, whilst employed by his wife. Claire fails to entrap Patrick and reports back, however the next day, his wife is found brutally murdered.

Claire is initially suspected, but then becomes involved with the police in attempting to prove that Patrick is the perpetrator or does she.....?

This is an absorbing, page turning thriller which will keep you guessing until the very end.

Warning: There are some sexually explicit scenes in keeping with the Baudelaire work "The Flowers of Evil".



As summer mellows into autumn, and the rowans outside my house blaze with berries, I wait impatiently for the Redwings to arrive.

From Scandinavia and Russia, they fly 500 miles across the North Sea. a risky journey in rough weather or fog. Watchers on the Yorkshire and Lincolnshire coasts may see thousands of birds come at a time: some fall at their feet, too weary to be afraid. Birders with audio kit then listen for the 'seep seep' calls of huge flocks passing overhead at night, dispersing south. Others come from Iceland to winter in Ireland and Scotland.

The Redwing, Turdus iliacus, is like a smaller song thrush, but look for the pale eye stripe, which stands out even when its red-flushed flank is hidden. It sometimes flocks with the larger Fieldfare, handsome with grey head, black tail and chestnut back.

If you hear a bustle in a berry-laden hedgerow this month, it won't be Led Zeppelin's 'spring clean for the May Queen' - but it could be feasting Redwings. They are shy and subtle, vocalising softly, shuffling and flitting within and between hedgerow trees. You might hear a snatch of 'subsong', a short murmur of notes, but the full song is saved for the breeding arounds of the north.



Last winter the Redwings didn't discover my rowans until December, but in November I was delighted to find them on the hollies in Green Wood. Later in the year, after they've had all the berries, they will scour the fallow fields for earthworms. I saw them last autumn south of Amersham near the HS2 works; in company with Fieldfares between Beaconsfield and Coleshill: and all winter in the fields and hedgerow trees between Seer Green and Jordans.



Wendover - canal and woods



A beautiful walk along a little known disused canal and through stunning woodland

Length: 6 miles

Start point: Wendover

Difficulty: Moderate

David Tryon has given us this description of a walk to enjoy in the autumn sunshine.

A bit further afield this month, but this is a varied and beautiful walk with just one longish hill up to the top of Wendover Woods. Start from the car park near the library in the centre of Wendover and head down the High Street and along the Aylesbury Road, taking the first road right through the houses. Just before a bridge turn left on a footpath which takes you down to a disused canal. This was built in the 1790s as the Wendover extension of the Grand Union but has not been used for about a century due to leakage of the water. However, it has now become a pretty nature reserve under the management of the Wendover Canal Trust, and it is possible to see many varieties of birds including Herons and Kingfishers.

Follow the canal for 1½ miles to Halton, where the towpath changes sides via a road bridge. Continue on the other bank for 100 metres to a bridge, then head right, away from the canal, into the grounds of RAF Halton. Turn left on the driveway and then right on a footpath and continue to the entrance at the main road. Cross the road and go up the hill into Wendover Woods, taking the left fork angling away from the boundary of the woods. You will eventually reach the Visitor Centre at the top of the hill, where there is a café if a short stop is desired. Afterwards, pass through the car parks and follow the paths marked on the map as you head generally south and downhill for a mile or so until you reach Hale Lane.

Turn right on the lane, and right again at a T junction at the bottom of the hill. After 50 metres, take a path to the left and then right on another path back to the library and the car park with several pubs available nearby in Wendover.


