
Thought for the Month

Holy Trinity Wins Bronze!



No, not an Olympic medal... Holy Trinity won the Bronze Eco Church award from A Rocha, in June 2021.

A Rocha ("The Rock") is a Christian organization engaging communities in nature conservation, founded in Portugal and established in countries around the world.

To win our award, Holy Trinity had to achieve points in five key areas:

- 1. Worship and teaching
- 2. Management of church buildings
- 3. Management of church land
- 4. Community and global engagement
- 5. Lifestyle

The process began with a Church of England - sponsored energy audit in 2019.

Since then we've:

- · draft-proofed the church doors
- installed LED lights with more to come
- committed to using only ecofriendly cleaning products
- aimed to buy locally, e.g. the Jordans Community Store
- managed our churchyard to help wildlife by leaving some areas to grow naturally
- carried out a churchyard wildlife survey
- changed our energy contract to a 'green' supplier
- audited our utility bills and reduced unnecessary heating
- minimised printing and recycled all our paper
- celebrated our stewardship of God's Earth in our worship

The Bronze award puts Holy Trinity on the Eco Church map, along with more than 1,000 other UK churches, including our own benefice partner, Chalfont St Giles, also a Bronze winner.

We aren't resting on our laurels: we'll look for more ways to meet the challenge of climate change and biodiversity loss. In August we held a Climate Sunday service as part

of the national 'Churches Together' initiative; and we also signed the 'Time is Now' declaration which unites the Church of England, other faith groups, and UK charities in the 'Climate Coalition', calling for our government to lead the world in tackling climate change.

Jordans Young children have a natural curiosity about the natural world and sadly it is our hurried lives that stop the development of this and propel our young into the indoor world of bought toys. Discovering the wonders of the natural world leads to so much including acquiring a responsibility for the world that we live in. In the group young children's need for physical activity will be encouraged and there will be activities to develop their balance and confidence. Of course there will also be areas simply to play in with

Seer Green church couple off to Uganda



After nearly 18 months of waiting, we are set to start our work in Uganda in late September. At the end of July, President Museveni announced an easing of the lockdown that had been in place since the middle of June to stem another Covid wave. The new rules mean that travel is now possible in Kampala so that we will be able to get around the city by car.

We will be going to Uganda with Clarion Trust International, the charity run by Revd Stephen Gaukroger who has given talks in Seer Green. They will second us to various Christian charities. Both of us will be attached to a charity called CRANE which organises care for poor and vulnerable children where Alison will be the Medical Advisor and Paul the Business Advisor. Alison will also work as a GP and counsellor, having recently completed a certificate in Christian counselling, at the AIM Tumaini clinic which serves

missionaries and people working with NGOs on the "frontline" including those working in the refugee camps in Northern Uganda.

Paul hopes to teach at a Christian university in Kampala which trains bright, young Ugandans to develop and run technology businesses, as well as teaching at a theological college where he will be able to deploy his recent theological studies. He will also be working with the Bible Society of Uganda having recently been a trustee of the British Bible Society.

We have found an apartment in the centre of Kampala which we will use as our base. We have some experience of living in Africa, having worked in rural Zambia in 1990. However, living in a busy city and learning a new culture and getting to know people will take our time and energy initially. We pray that we will be able to use our experience and skills to support the various organisations we will be working with.

Our commissioning service is at 3.00pm on 5 September at Seer Green Baptist Church and we would love you to join us as we commit our time and service in Uganda to God. We look forward to seeing you then.

Our charity for September - Kisiizi Hospital

Our Charity of the Month for September is Kisiizi Hospital and School of Nursing, Uganda. Situated in a beautiful but remote valley in the south-west corner of the country, Kisiizi Hospital was founded in 1958 by Dr John and Mrs Doreen Sharpe under the aegis of the Church of Uganda. It serves a wide area of hand-to-mouth subsistence farming, providing a full range of medical services for typically over 8,000 admissions a year and twice that number of out-patients. Graduates from its School of Nursing serve throughout Uganda and elsewhere.

Fees are charged where possible, often financed by its own local insurance scheme, but in this very poor area no one is ever turned away for lack of funds. Otherwise the work is largely dependent on charitable donations, in the UK organised through Kisiizi Partners, based in Reading, who in normal times run an annual Kisiizi Friends'Day.

These are not normal times. Uganda is only now experiencing the full flood of Covid cases for which Kisiizi, like our own NHS, has had to make expensive provision while tourism – a major source of its finance – is at a standstill. This follows a devastating flood a year ago which temporarily interrupted the electricity supplied by its generator under the famous Kisiizi Falls. All staff have accepted a temporary 25% cut in pay.

Wildlife detectives spot over 100 suspects

What do Pale Yellow-Eyed Grass, Fox & Cubs, Knapweed, the Garden Snail and the Sailor Beetle have in common?

Answer: Along with 98 other plant and animal species, they were discovered hiding out in Holy Trinity churchyard.

Readers may have noticed that this summer, our churchyard got a little wilder than usual, with flowers blossoming and meadow grasses billowing. This gave us the chance to take part in 'Churches Count on Nature', a special 'citizen science' partnership between the Church of England, the Church of Wales, A Rocha and Caring for God's Acre, a Christian charity focusing on churchyard heritage.

Until 1848 when Holy Trinity church was built, the land surrounding it was the village green. It has probably never been cultivated, though it may once have been grazed; so it, like other churchyards, can act as a valuable sanctuary for native wildlife. In recognition of this, churches across the UK were encouraged to survey their burial grounds during the week of 5-13 June 2021.

In Seer Green we had a head start in the form of botanical surveys carried out in the 1980s; our 'wildlife detectives' used this checklist to see how many of the species seen then still survived, and also looked to identify new arrivals and to add animals and birds to the tally.

Some ten keen amateur naturalists took part in the survey, including both adults and children – many thanks to all! We identified 61 of the 93 original

plant and tree species still growing in the churchyard, plus 42 new plant, bird, invertebrate and tree species.

Caring for God's Acre now has our data and will make it available to the National Biodiversity Network, advancing the understanding of nature in UK churchyards.

Jobs in the garden for September

- Collect seeds from perennials and hardy annuals, store them in labelled envelopes for sowing next spring.
- Sow hardy annual seeds such as cornflowers, nigella and poppies in September, this should result in stronger, earlier flowers next year.
- Divide and replant large clumps of perennials once they finish flowering.
- Continue to propagate plants by taking cuttings. Penstemons, fuchsias, salvias and pelargoniums are ideal but they will need protecting from frost.
- Continue to deadhead and feed container displays some may keep going until the first frosts. Continue to deadhead all garden flowers too.
- Keep camellias well-watered, as buds will be forming now for next year.
- · Plant daffodil bulbs for spring displays next year.
- Rake out the thatch from your lawn, aerate the ground with a garden fork and re-seed any bare patches. Temperatures in September should still be warm enough for the seed to germinate really quickly but keep it well watered if it's dry.

"Summertime, and the living is easy, fish are jumping and the cotton is high".

Well, here on the allotments, the slugs are munching, and the sweetcorn is high! We are definitely seeing the fruits of our labours, and if we could have a bit more sunshine through August then the tomatoes will ripen, and the squashes will swell. The bees are drunk on nectar from the variety of flowers: dahlias, sweet peas, feverfew, lilies, echinacea and hollyhocks; the nasturtiums make great ground cover and weed control whilst blazing with many colours, butterflies dance throughout the day and, at night, the evening primrose invites the attention of moths.

Whilst some of us are familiar with the concoction of elderflower cordial

or its fizzier cousin champagne, and sloe collectors are a common sight on the Recreation Ground come Autumn in preparation of the Christmas sloe gin, we have recently discovered some lesser burdock growing in our hedgerow - so we may well be exploring the delights of dandelion and burdock before too long.

Meanwhile, we add raspberries and tayberries into our breakfast muesli, dust off our courgette recipes, make up a salad or two, dig up some potatoes for supper, slice a homegrown cucumber into our gin and tonic and reflect on the glories to come.





Less than half an hour's drive from Seer Green on the outskirts of Uxbridge you can now visit one of the most remarkable and pivotal locations from the Second World War.

Seventy-six steps below ground, the original bunker and control room which was responsible for the air defence of London and the south of England during World War II, is still in place exactly as it was in 1940 at the height of the Battle of Britain, when the future of this country was hanging by a slender thread.

Guided tours of this extraordinary secret place offer a dramatic and inspiring insight into the ingenuity, courage and tenacity of the men and women who worked here under the most intense and pressurised conditions.





Above ground a new state-of-the-art visitor centre with interactive displays and original artefacts chronicles the development of our air defence system between the two World Wars and you can listen to first-hand accounts from many of those who were involved in what came to be known as this country's finest hour. There is also a virtual tour of the bunker for those who can't manage the steps (which are staggered and not too daunting).

A visit to the Battle of Britain Bunker is a fascinating, moving and extremely humbling experience, and with a pleasant on-site café and shop, makes a very rewarding outing. Bunker tours should be pre-booked via the website.

Miss Benson's Beetle - Rachel Joyce

In 1950, Margery Benson leaves her job and advertises for a companion to accompany her on the adventure of a lifetime, to find the elusive golden beetle in New Caledonia. The unlikely successful candidate is Enid Pretty, a blonde bombshell with her own reasons for wanting to escape. The author, Rachel Joyce, writes wonderful characters and this book is no exception. The relationship between the two women during their daring expedition grows into a close, warm friendship. The book is at times emotional and moving, a wonderful insight into colonial life, independent women and friendship. This completely delightful book is a treat to savour.

Shuggie Bain – Douglas Stuart

The 2020 Booker Winner is a heart-wrenching read. We follow the life of young Shuggie in 1980's Glasgow. The love he has for his mother Agnes is unconditional, despite her addiction to alcohol. The reader is totally immersed in life in the tough area of Pithead where families are all struggling on the breadline. Agnes is a complicated character who despite her problems, tries not to let her standards drop both in her appearance and housekeeping.

As the story unfolds, Shuggie's voice emerges powerfully with startling precision and love (in the unique Glasgow patter that brings a certain dry humour). It's an incredible story of a mother and son relationship fighting to survive against the odds but embedded within Shuggie's narrative is that teenage voyage of discovery. A tough read, but well worth it.



V for Victory – Lissa Evans

WWII seems to be dragging on for ever, in 1944 people seem to be just getting on with things (sounds familiar!) Set in London, this story covers the last weeks of the war. Teenager Noel is guite accepting of his lot, living with his aunt Vee in a boarding house near Hampstead Heath, he cheerfully does the cooking trying ingenious ways to make the rationed food more interesting. He builds a friendship with Winnie an ARP warden whose work really sets the scene of wartime London. Relationships, secrets and wonderful characters make this a charming, relatable read. This is the 3rd in a series featuring the same characters, but can be read as a stand alone, although the other two, Old Baggage and Crooked Heart are also well worth a read.



Lavender Shortbread Hearts

Perfect for wedding favours or simply served alongside strawberries and cream.

Ingredients

- 50g caster sugar
- · 100g butter, softened
- · 125g plain flour
- · 25g cornflour
- 1 tsp dried edible lavender flower heads
- Fresh lavender sprigs (optional)
- · Extra caster sugar

Method

- Preheat oven to 145c (fan).
- Place all the ingredients except the lavender sprigs into a food processor and whizz until combined to form a dough.

- Roll out the dough to 5mm thick, then using a heart shaped biscuit cutter, cut out shapes and place on a baking paper lined tray.
- Press a sprig of lavender in each shape (if desired) and sprinkle with a light coating of extra caster sugar.
- Bake for 25-30 minutes or until lightly golden.
- Cool on a cooling rack and store in an airtight container.

Makes 12-15 biscuits depending on the size of biscuit cutter.



Improvements to the recreation ground

As you are aware the Parish Council maintains the Recreation Ground and look for ways to improve the facilities it offers. Following many requests the Parish Council are planning to apply for grant funding for two extra benches (with backs!) at the Rec and we have been offered funding for a football goal for residents to use.

The goal will be situated in line with the front of the cricket nets towards the corner where footpath 16 leads towards the centre of the village but far enough away from the path and tree line so as not to cause any issues as shown by Cllr Anderson and Cllr Holder in the photo below.

We hope this will be enjoyed by all those who want to play football and that it will stop any further damage to the cricket nets which have been used recently.
