I am contacting you in the hope that the Devon Churches Rural Forum may be able to help with our current study into older men's experiences of loneliness. We are researchers at The School for Policy Studies at the University of Bristol and Age UK is our partner in this study. We are working to develop an in-depth understanding of the formal and informal ways in which marginalised groups of older men (65+ years) seek to maintain social engagement in later life and combat loneliness.
