

A questioning faith

We will welcome one another to our service on Easter morning using the words 'Alleluia, Christ is risen; He is risen indeed. Alleluia!'

We reach Easter having journeyed through Lent and reminded ourselves of the events leading up to Jesus' Crucifixion during Holy Week.

The Easter story shows us how when things seem at their worst, when everything has gone wrong, we can often find signs of new life and new hope - if we are open to being surprised.

The message is mind-blowing! This is not the story of an appearance of the risen Christ but of the disappearance of a body. No one witnesses the actual resurrection. We don't hear the ending of the story, but rather a beginning. The gospel account of the first Easter morning is left open-ended. The key person in the narrative is not there!

The Gospel account of Easter morning may leave us with more questions than answers. Here we see, in the absence of God, something of the mystery and unknowability of God. Here faith and doubt are not opposite extremes but part of a process, a journey - a journey that values questions. Does our faith have to be certain or is it strong enough to allow for questions? Are questions to be seen as threatening or could they be God's way of challenging us to think more deeply about our faith?

It is good to question and explore our faith. It is only by doing this that we can come to our own understanding and belief. Maybe we have questions about the resurrection that we have never dared to ask. The disciples certainly had their doubts and questions, yet these were the people who witnessed to the good news and on whom the Church was founded!

What is our response to the story? Are we willing to be part of it? To become part of it means not just hearing but living the story. Why not come along to St Mary's one Sunday morning to find out more?

Remembering

David Townshend

David was born in Rawalpindi in 1924. His father was an engineer on the Indian railways. He joined the Royal Engineers in 1943 and was later sent to Bombay to be part of the Indian army. He remained with the Royal Engineers for 27 years and enjoyed postings to Libya, Malaya, Cyprus and Germany. On Remembrance Sunday, he wore with pride the medals he had been awarded.

In 1954 David married Clare and they had four children. He was a caring family man, fondly remembered for hurrying home early if one of the children was sick and buying doughnuts as an unexpected treat. He was a patient father who gallantly helped all of his children learn to drive and willingly helped clarify maths homework.

In 1971 David left the army and (after a brief spell in business, cut short by the recession), began working for Southwark Council as a Principal Administrative Officer, working first in the Architects' and then the Property Division. It was at this point that the family moved to Shortlands and soon began attending St Mary's.


In retirement David became increasingly active in the life of St Mary's. He became a Sidesman, was elected onto the Parochial Church Council and Deanery Synod, and served for three years as a Churchwarden. He also became involved with the services at Durham House, taking on a leading role when it looked as if their continuation was uncertain.

David also attended adult education classes and with his newly acquired word processing skills produced his memoirs, aptly entitled 'Humour Guides the Pen' and later, 'Whither Religion?'

David was a kind, thoughtful and practical man: he held regular coffee mornings to bring friends together and welcome newcomers, and over many years he gave less physically able parishioners a lift to church. As Clare's illness progressed he became her full time carer and showed immense fortitude and kindness.

In September 2014, David's declining health meant that he moved to Cheshire to live with his elder daughter Gemma. It gave him pleasure to keep up with news of St Mary's via SPAN.

David is survived by Clare, their four children and nine grandchildren.

Since 1995 St Mary's Shortlands has been twinned with the Parish of St Francis of Assisi in Douai, Northern France. Mission of the month

LIVING WELL

Living Well began in 2011 in response to growing numbers of people calling at the vicarage of Holy Trinity Beckenham church in Penge, asking for help. Since then over 600 people from across Bromley and South East London have taken part in Living Well. Services are free to all and include a foodbank, a community lunch, mental health support, debt advice and help with addiction.

Living Well's founder, Rev. Nick Read, states its aims thus: 'to build together a caring community where people feel accepted, loved and valued. Our name, 'Living Well' expresses both our intention and hope for the people who turn to us. It is also a reminder of Jesus' words to the Samaritan woman (John 4:10). He met her at a well and talked of giving her 'living water'.'

Living Well works closely with local churches, schools, businesses, individuals and groups to provide a place where people feel welcome. They can enjoy a hot meal, some food to take home, friendly conversation and advice if needed. Recently activities have expanded. There is a community garden where vegetables are grown for Friday lunch. There is a Lottery funded art therapy group, a music group, a benefits advice clinic, a clothes bank and washing facilities. Retired GPs and other professionals kindly give their services.

Saint of the Month

St David - 1st March

St David – or Dewi Sant in Welsh – lived in the 6th century and is the patron saint of Wales. Most of what we know about him comes from a biography written in the late 11th century by a Welsh monk called Rhigyfarch.

Following his education, David went on a pilgrimage through parts of South Wales and the West of England. He was one of the first big names to visit Glastonbury, where he consecrated a church on the site of the future abbey. He became renowned as a teacher and preacher, founding monastic settlements and churches in Wales.

Many miracles were attributed to St David. One miracle often recounted is that, once, when he was preaching to a crowd at Llanddewi Brefi, those on the outer edges could not hear. So he spread a handkerchief on the ground, and stood on it to preach, and the ground rose up beneath him, and all could hear. A white dove, which became his emblem, was seen settling on his shoulder.

He made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem where he was anointed as an archbishop by the patriarch. His principal monastery, where the community was very strict, was at St David's, Pembrokeshire where he died and was buried

As well as Wales, he is also the patron saint of doves, vegetarians and poets.
