

A step on the Christian journey

On Pentecost Sunday we admitted six of our young congregation members to Communion after they had completed a course of preparation.

Since that famous journey on the road to Emmaus, when two bereaved friends invited a stranger to share their family meal and recognised the risen Lord, groups of Jesus' followers have met him in the breaking of bread. At Communion, Christ's sacrifice on the cross is recalled and it is the way in which the vast majority of Christians obey the Lord's command, 'Do this in remembrance of me.'

Many will be more familiar with children being confirmed, so why this change? The Church of England recognised that children were being confirmed at younger and younger ages, often as young as eleven, and for a variety of reasons. Some chose to be confirmed because their friends were or their parents thought they should.

When people are baptised, they are initiated as members of the Church. When people start to receive Communion, it is seen as a stage in their Christian journey.

Children who already receive Communion will ideally be confirmed during their late teens, so it becomes an

adult affirmation of faith as well as the reception of the grace of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation is a confirming of the promises made for them at their baptism. This becomes a decision made when they are older and able to answer for themselves, knowing their faith to be their own.

This has been happening in the Church of England since just before the turn of the century and at St Mary's since 2008.

When children are admitted to Communion, it means that the children share in the bread and wine: they join in the family meal. It is a demonstration of grace: God's generosity to us and our response to him. This expression of God's love can change lives. It cannot be earned and is not a prize for being good.

When we nurture children in the Christian faith, we share experiences and examples with them, as well as teaching them about this faith. *Rev Morag Finch*

Annual meeting held

Over 50 people attended St Mary's Annual Parochial Church Council meeting in April. The meeting elected Adolph Williams and Coreen Corbin as churchwardens.

239 people are now on the electoral roll, a slight increase on last year. Thanks were given to Nick Stoffel who had been Electoral Roll Officer for many years, and to Margaret Shaw who has taken on the role.

The meeting received Rev Morag's report of the last 12 months, listing many and varied events throughout the year, including the commemoration of the 60th anniversary of the church building.

Tim Dawson, the Treasurer, presented the accounts. Overall, there was a comparatively small shortfall for the year. Expenditure was higher than in 2014, mainly due to works to repair the roof, and annual planned giving was slightly lower than previously. More work will be done on the roof this year, once better weather arrives, but the cost will be less than had been feared.

The meeting heard of various activities throughout the year to repair and maintain the church buildings, and thanked all those who contribute to this work.

Leaving the Parochial Church Council (PCC) as their terms came to an end were Derek Cooper, Susie Shelton and Adrian Bingham: the meeting thanked them for their work. Sally Aldred, David Jefferys, Kay Coleman and Tony Wright-Jones were confirmed as joining the PCC.

Rev Morag thanked all those who do so much in so many roles to keep the church going: it is much appreciated. She looked forward to an awayday in May at which the PCC would be thinking about how the church will move forward, listening to what God is calling us to do, to include our vision for the use of the church halls and site.

What is prayer visiting?

Since 2008, during the summer months, a small team of people from St Mary's has been visiting homes in the parish. Introductory letters are delivered in advance to a number of roads asking people if they have anything they would like the church to pray for. This is then followed up a few days later with a brief visit, where the team collect any prayer requests and bring them back to the church for inclusion at Sunday services and daily prayers. The team has visited nearly every home in the parish; they are only unable to gain access to gated communities.

There is no praying on doorsteps or anything like that! The team goes out for an hour at a time, usually between 7 and 8pm. Most visits last just a few minutes – some a little longer.

Over the years there has been a very positive response to the visits. Many conversations that start out 'oh, I'm not a church goer' or 'I don't believe any of that' end with people asking for prayer for loved ones or difficult situations in their lives. Confidentiality is respected, and for many prayer requests only first names are used.

As Christians we believe in the power of prayer. It is our experience that prayer releases God's love into the world and into our lives. If you don't share our belief in prayer, or don't want to share personal matters with us, then we won't bother you any longer than it takes to say 'No thank you'. Otherwise we look forward to seeing you either on the doorstep or at St Mary's.

Haven't seen us, but you would like to make a prayer request? Do feel free to pop in to the church porch any weekday morning, where you can leave a short message on our 'Prayer Tree'. These requests are also offered up during our weekly services.

Saint of the Month St Peter – 29 June

St Peter was one of Jesus' twelve apostles and a leader of the early church. Peter started life named Simon. He and his brother Andrew were fishermen and lived in Capernaum on the north shore of the Sea of Galilee.

He was married – we know Jesus healed his mother-in-law. He owned a house in Capernaum and the boat that Jesus used to preach to the multitudes who were pressing on him at the shore of the Sea of Galilee. He seems to have been quite fiery and liable to get carried away by his temper, as, when Jesus was arrested, Peter cut off the ear of a servant of the High Priest. Jesus changed his name to Peter (the rock) saying that on this rock he would build his church.

Jesus also said 'I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven', thus giving rise to the idea of Peter at the pearly gates.

After Jesus' resurrection Peter was an extremely important figure in the early church. He went to Lydda, Joppa and Caesarea, Antioch, Corinth and Jerusalem where he was briefly imprisoned. Tradition has it that he finished up in Rome, where, with St Paul he founded the Christian church and became the first Pope. He was martyred and is buried under St Peter's Basilica in Rome.

Today the expression 'For Pete's sake' refers to St Peter, while St Peter's fish – a form of tilapia – referred to in Matthew's gospel as the fish with a coin in its mouth, makes a tasty, if bony, dish when caught in the Sea of Galilee.

Christians Against Poverty

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) was started in 1996 by John Kirkby. After his own personal experience of debt, he believed that God was calling him to sacrifice his career in finance and use his knowledge of the industry to help the poor, and in particular those whose lives were crippled by debt. Beginning with a small donation, John began to work locally with parents who couldn't feed their children, people facing eviction and others living in fear caused by debt. He used his expertise to negotiate with creditors, set up budgeting systems and offer a lifeline.

Realising the need for such support across the country, he began to replicate this work across the UK by partnering with churches and training debt counsellors. Since then, CAP has grown rapidly. There are now 301 CAP Debt Centres across the country with over 16,000 people helped each year. CAP provides debt counselling through home visits and offer personal support to people as they journey to become debt free.

In recent years, CAP has expanded its services to tackle the causes of debt and poverty. CAP Job Clubs help people into employment, CAP Release Groups help people get control of their addictions and CAP Life skills equips people to live well on low incomes.

John Kirby writes, 'I am overwhelmed by what God has done. To see thousands of lives changed every year is truly wonderful... Jesus met people's needs with love, compassion and practical help. Our desire is simply to do the same.'
