

## **MY DAY JOB...that was**

Although now long retired, I was for over thirty years a teacher of History in a variety of South London schools.

At Bullers Wood and Eltham College I had the luxury of going to work each day in a beautiful historic building. At other times my school was in relatively modern but dilapidated accommodation of crumbling cement. For two years I was a Supply Teacher, going for a few weeks or months into most schools in the Borough of Bromley. For me the task remained essentially the same: keep them fascinated!

History is a great subject. There's a story to latch on to, an argument to be made. Unlike some subjects, History is not about truth and eternal laws: it deals with the changes of things that change. I believe that if we don't know where we are coming from it's harder to see where we are going. Leading the young through the pages of history is as much about preparing them for the future as it is about mulling over dead issues.

Being the leader in such an environment was fun. It made little difference to my pleasure whether I was before a class of A Level Eltham College pupils, all heading for university, or struggling in the midst of thirty twelve year olds who had somehow found themselves in the bottom stream in an inner London comprehensive. The job involved starting from where they were, leading them on and always glancing sideways to spot an individual problem, related or unrelated to the History lesson.

I miss that world of course, but within twelve months of leaving it I began to acquire a string of grandchildren, all living nearby, so in a way my class has not left me.

# **Mission of the month**

## **Mines Advisory Group**

In 1989, two brothers felt



compelled to do something to protect people from the crippling and fatal threat of unexploded landmines in war ravaged countries. Their solution was to set up MAG (Mines Advisory Group).

Since then, and thanks to them, countless lives have been saved. 400,000 landmines and cluster munitions, more than 16 million other items including ammunition have been destroyed and over 100,000 risk education sessions have been held for vulnerable communities.

Thanks to MAG, today there is a Mine Ban Treaty to which 160 countries have signed up.

Tomorrow, ten people will lose their lives or suffer serious injury due to unexploded devices. Together let's protect the men, women & children who still live under such threats, by supporting MAG in their endeavours.

Col Bob Stewart will speak at St Mary's on 20 July at the 10.30am service about his personal experiences in war-torn Bosnia and the sterling work done by MAG that he witnessed first-hand. All are welcome!
