#### Services in Church from September

We are delighted that St. Mary's will be open for public worship once again from 6<sup>th</sup> September. The pattern of services will closely follow our normal pattern:

# Sunday (from 6<sup>th</sup> September)

10.30am Holy Communion, held in Church with a congregation and with live or recorded music

10.30am Holy Communion

We will be following strict guidelines in respect of social distancing, hand sanitising, etc, and communion will be in one kind (bread only). Restrictions have been lifted regarding live music, so services may include contributions from the choir, music group or recorded music, all subject to following government and CofE guidelines.

I look forward to welcoming you all back into our church building for worship and the sharing of the most holy of Sacraments together as one body, present in our church building, another step forward in regaining life as we knew it back into our church and community.

#### **Christian Aid Lebanon Appeal**

The massive explosion in the port of Beirut on 4<sup>th</sup> August caused a huge shock wave through densely populated areas of the city. Neighbourhoods were reduced to rubble by the blast, along with hospitals and crucial stores containing 85% f the country's grain and medical supplies. More than 750,000 people have been affected by this disaster, which left an estimated 300,000 people homeless and families without food or access to medical care.



Christian Aid is working with local partners in the most affected areas to distribute food and water, clothes, mattresses and blankets; provide access to medicines and health services; find temporary shelters for families, and provide minor repairs for homes. In times of crisis, all acts of compassion, big and small, can make a world of difference. #### Church opening

St Mary's Church continues to be open for personal prayer and reflection on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday, between 10am and 3pm. For those unable to leave their homes or who will struggle to get to the church, our pastoral team is available to talk through any concerns you might have.

#### **Face coverings**

Following government guidance, we are now required to wear face coverings when visiting the church for a service or for private prayer, if other people might be present. Please remember to bring a face covering with you when you visit, and note that wearing a face covering is not a replacement for physical distancing and regular hand washing. We have also been asked to encourage people to consider re-usable cloth masks in order to limit the amount of plastic waste.

#### **Our new Curate**

As announced some months ago, Revd. Gary and the church of St Mary's have been selected by the Diocese of Rochester to support a curate in training, starting from September 2020. This posting will last for three or more years. Our new curate is to be Mrs Beverley Ejimofo and we look forward to meeting her very soon. Beverley has completed the first part of the diocese's clergy training and will be ordained as a Deacon on September 26th, which may take place via Zoom (online) or in Rochester Cathedral with a greatly reduced attendance due to COVID. She will officially start at St Mary's on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> September.

#### **Bromley Foodbank**

The items most needed at the moment are: *long life fruit juice, custard, rice pudding, squash, jam, packet mashed potato, cold meat (tinned), biscuits, shampoo, men's shower gel, men's deodorant, nappies size 5 or 6, washing detergent.* (They have plenty of beans, pasta, soup, rice, tomatoes.) There is now a collection box for the Foodbank in the church porch so items can be left there.

#### St Mary's Site Development - Update

Back in February and March we received very positive feedback about the extra space at the back of church that we created by removing the last two rows of pews on a trial basis. This helped us to see how we could make the space in church more flexible. Having heard this feedback, the PCC decided that we will retain this space and look to develop a greater range of activities during the week. Once we are able to meet together again we will reschedule the postponed meetings so that members of the congregation can hear what we've researched and ask questions about options for seating and flooring in church. We will listen to feedback about this before moving forwards and will continue to hold this project in our prayers as we seek to understand what God is asking us to do here in Shortlands. We have also started to consider whether there is potential to make greater use of audio-visual facilities in church once we are back in church (for example, streaming services to a wider audience) and to support our wider mission.
