MISSION OF THE MONTH

The Leprosy Mission

Leprosy is widely believed to be the world's oldest disease, and has continued to affect men, women and children for over 2,000 years.

It is also known as Hansen's Disease, after a Norwegian physician, Gerhard Hansen, who discovered the specific bacterium that causes leprosy as long ago as 1873. The number of new cases diagnosed remains at a steady global figure of over 200,000 every year. Early diagnosis and treatment with multi-drug therapy, which is freely available, can provide a cure and stops the disease progressing, rendering the sufferer non-infectious within just a few days of treatment.

The Leprosy Mission (TLM) continues to work hard in reversing the injustice caused by this devastating disease that, if untreated, can cause extensive nerve damage leading to loss of sensation, ulcers, infections, weakness in the eyelids causing blindness, permanent disability, deformity and long periods of hospitalisation and surgery, which may involve amputation.

TLM is a worldwide Christian charity with a vision for a world without leprosy, focussing on ten countries in Africa and Asia. Its work includes treatment, health care, surgery, physiotherapy, health awareness training, and providing small business loans to enable those affected to escape poverty and become independent.

The church's Traidcraft stall includes items sourced from The Leprosy Mission Shop and the purchase of such goods will provide further support for this charity. For further information please see the display at the back of the church throughout January and at

Valerie Redman

Valerie was born in Lewisham in 1935. The family later moved to Southborough, near Tunbridge Wells, where she became actively involved with St Thomas' church and the local cub scout pack. This is where she met Doug whom she married in 1957.

Their early years of marriage were spent in Aylesford and they attended Holy Trinity in Larkfield. Their involvement in the Youth Club was significant: many friendships were forged at this time which continued for over 60 years.

Valerie had worked in a furriers in Tunbridge Wells: she then joined the Reeds Paper Group in Aylesford where Doug worked as a surveyor. Andrew and Peter were born and then Valerie's life changed quite dramatically as Doug made the decision to become ordained.

Following ordination, Doug became curate at St Mary's Shortlands and Valerie's life as a clergy wife started in earnest. In all of the parishes where they served, Valerie was an integral part in the development of the local community. At St Edmund's West Kingsdown in the early 1970s and later at St John's Chatham, she worked tirelessly in pre-schools, with the Mothers Union, Young Wives Groups, Youth Clubs and all the unseen roles in support of Doug's ministry. Plus, of course, being a fulltime mother and wife.

In 1980 Valerie and Doug returned to St Mary's Shortlands and for 20 years she immersed herself in the life of the parish. Her involvement with the Mums and Toddlers Group was possibly her greatest love and she, in turn, was much loved by them.

In 2000 Valerie and Doug moved to Sissinghurst: whilst she enjoyed the increased opportunity for travel and relaxation, she was perhaps frustrated by her husband's 'retirement' being replaced with commitments across a significant part of Kent!

After Doug's death in 2016, Valerie suffered a number of extended periods of ill health which led to a move to a care home. She entered fully into that new life, welcoming new residents to their new surroundings, helping with the gardening, winning the weekly quiz, singing in the choir, flower arranging... She grasped the opportunities that her recovery had given her and, through her profound Christian faith, understood that she still had an important role to play in the life of those around her.

As she reached the final days of her life she was visited by members of staff, past and present, who wanted to say goodbye to someone who had touched their lives in a special way. She would not have said this of herself but, in her own way, she made a difference in this world.

A good turn

Guides from both St Mary's units enjoyed their Christmas celebrations. After a cinema trip and a sleepover in the church hall, they did a double good turn for the church. Bright and early, they worked on the Saturday morning clearing dead leaves from church gardens. Then - revived by hot chocolate and biscuits - they made 240 Christingles for the Christingle service.

St Barnabas

St. Barnabas sits in an almost hideaway position at the junction of two no-through roads, Perth Road and Oakhill Road. However, its associated hall, strangely called St. Peter's Hall, is some distance away in Park Langley!

The church was designed by the architects Stenning and Hall and drawings of both the proposed interior and exterior appeared in the Building News in January 1879, but it was not completed as per the designs. It was built in 1878/84 replacing the original iron church, one of many 'tin tabernacles', and the parish was created from that of St. George's Beckenham, the 'mother church'. Although it is a solid and imposing brick building, it lacks either a tower or the originally designed small spire to help locate it.



The church interior has an unusual mix of stone and bare brickwork with tall, narrow, rounded arched windows both in the chancel and high above either side of the nave. Its style is said to be of 'Early English as opposed to Decorated architecture' giving it a very different feel to St. George's. However, this appears to contrast with the pointed brick arches surmounting the stone columns between the nave and side aisles.

Most of the stained glass was destroyed in World War II; however, two windows designed by Karl Parsons (1912) survived, one depicting Mary and Joseph, the other Elizabeth and Zachariah. Parsons was associated with the Arts and Crafts movement, a South London boy who attended Haberdashers' Aske's Hatcham boys' school in New Cross. The rest of the glass is mid-20th century and was designed by Leonard Evetts, one of the most prolific stained glass artists at that time.

Other notable ornaments include the altar carvings depicting Christ's Passion and the later additions of the rood screen and figures either side of the chancel.

In 2022 St. Barnabas was merged back with St. George's to become a combined benefice.

Fun for children at St Mary's

At St Mary's we love welcoming young people and families into church and we have a number of groups specifically for this.

Junior Church – this takes place every Sunday during term time and is what some people might know as Sunday School. Our young people aged from under two up to 18 are invited to go up to the church hall during the 10.30am service, where they are taught all about God's work by an amazing group of volunteers. These sessions usually follow a structure of games, bible reading and then an arts and crafts activity to consolidate the learning, so they have something to show those at home and the congregation what they have been up to. There is quite often food involved too!

Tea Time Together – from 4-5.30pm on the second Sunday of each month in term time. This group is for families with children aged two up to year 5, to come and learn about God. There is always a song, a story, arts and crafts and games around a religious theme. The Community Cafe also kindly provide refreshments of tea/coffee, squash and cake for all who attend.

Shortlands Youth Group - also on the second Sunday of each month from 6-7.30pm in term time. This is a social group for those in Year 6 to Year 13 to come and spend time socially with other people their age. There is air hockey, table tennis, video games, board games, arts and crafts, outdoor games in the summer months and lots of free snacks!

We would love to welcome you and your young people to any of these groups in this new year!
