Already, I am delighted that we have used the time in lockdown to install kitchen facilities at the back of the church. We have also created a little extra seating space as we consider starting a community café (when it is safe and appropriate).

We will have audio-visual facilities installed by Easter to allow for live-streaming and recording of services and community events taking place in church. Each of these initiatives represents a real move forward towards St. Mary's becoming the hub of your community, something that so many have expressed a desire for.

As we journey towards Easter, let it be a time of hope for each of us. Hope that we continue to move forward and out of the pandemic; hope that we maintain and continue with the sense of community that has grown so strongly; hope that we can accept that out of adversity good things can happen.

Mothering Sunday 14 March

Barbara Skinner

Barbara was born in Ladywell in 1925. She had a tough childhood, with her father dying of TB when she was 3 and her mother also, just before the vaccine became available.

When the war came, she left school at 14, and was evacuated for a while before training as a secretary. She worked for a while at the Admiralty, sending orders to the fleets.

Barbara met Alfred when working for a printing union. She made sure she was just outside the building when he went to lunch, and six months later they were married! They moved to Bromley and their son Stephen was in the first cohort of children to start at Highfield when it opened in 1959. Two further children, Jeff and Hazel, also went there.

The family attended the Church and Sunday School sporadically and all three children were members of the Go-Club – Barbara felt you could not make a choice about faith if you did not know the facts. Alfred was involved in the St Mary's players and Barbara in the Young Wives.

Barbara worked for many years as a Lecturer in Business Studies at Bromley College of Technology, a job she loved. But the lure of Devon beckoned, and she and Alfred spent 16 happy years in their home by the sea in Teignmouth, where they raised funds for the local hospice: they also travelled widely and came back to London frequently to help with the grandchildren, attending their events and celebrations.

She returned to Bromley once Alfred died, where she joined Probus, U3A and Craft and Chatter at St Mary's, where she felt at home.

She always did things 'at the gallop'. She had a real enthusiasm, positive energy and a zest for life. She was a great conversationalist and a good listener. Barbara filled her garden, her wardrobe, and the lives of her family with colour.

Barbara was blessed with exceptional health. It was only in the past three years that she had to make the tough decision to move into care. The last year was difficult, as the pandemic curtailed care home visits. True to her motto, she left the party when it was no longer fun.

She is greatly missed by her children, their partners and her six grandchildren.



Holy Week at St Mary's

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, 28 March. During the week, look out for the Stations of the Cross within the church grounds. This family-friendly activity will lead you through the Easter story.

On Easter Day (Sunday 4 April), in addition to our 10.30am service of Holy Communion which will be streamed via Facebook, the church will be open from 10am to 5pm for private prayer and reflection.

From 12 noon there will be events for the whole family. The choir will be singing traditional Easter hymns in church between 12 noon and 1.30pm. In the church grounds, enjoy our Junior Church activities, exploring the Stations of the Cross, and a Traidcraft stall selling a variety of goods (including chocolate!)

St. Mary's church follows all COVID regulations and guidance issued by the Government and Church of England: all events are subject to change.



Morning Prayer

When the first lockdown began, so did the live streaming of Morning Prayer via Facebook each morning at 9am, excluding Sunday.

Morning Prayer is a daily discipline followed by all in ministry, so it seemed a natural progression to hold this service online to support our parishioners and wider community.

Little did we know that Morning Prayer would become such an important part of the lives of the regular group of participants and leaders, allowing us to bring the love of God into homes not just in Shortlands but around the world.

I have personally found leading and participating in these daily services a great way to start my day. It helps to give my day rhythm and focus, putting God at the centre, whilst giving me an

inner strength to face the challenges of the day.

Having different leaders with differing styles each day keeps the service fresh, and gives a variety of insights and reflections on the daily Bible readings.

The part I find most helpful is the time of prayer we spend together, bringing situations and individuals to God, giving thanks for the many blessings that we have, and asking God to hold our community here in Shortlands and our new friends from around the world.

MISSION OF THE MONTH

Living Well Bromley

Living Well Bromley is a community hub based at Holy Trinity church in Penge, working with marginalised people and those struggling with the effects of poverty and social isolation. This is achieved through the provision of a variety of services including advocacy, counselling, food and clothes, community meals, art therapy, community choir, podiatry and community garden as well as prayer ministry.

Since lockdown in March 2020, Living Well has been through challenging times but has adapted its service provision to ensure social distancing and the safety of guests and volunteers. The food bank continues to be open 3 times a week but is now outside in a marquee. Funding has been gained to build an outdoor storage area to house extra supplies.

Living Well works with and supports other organisations following an approach from Fareshare who provide surplus supermarket products. The sit-down community lunch on a Friday has become a take-away hot meal. A home delivery service has been introduced for those self-isolating, and a counselling service, 'Listening Well', was launched offering telephone support, online group therapy and one to one counselling sessions.

The pandemic has increased isolation amongst those who are already struggling with mental illness, stress and anxiety. In recent months there has been an increase in the number of rough sleepers who present themselves at Living Well, the majority of whom have complex needs.

Living Well's long-term vision is to expand its services to include full-time counselling, drink and drug dependency support and work with other local support agencies.


