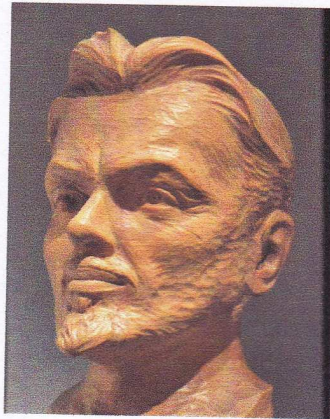
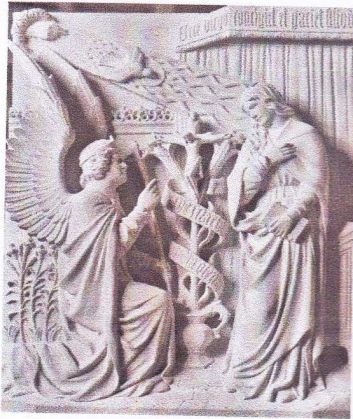


Alec Miller 1879-1961

Carver Guildsman Sculptor

Alec Miller designed and carved the organ case and the reredos in the side chapel of St Mary's Church. He was born in poverty in Glasgow, became a trained woodcarver, worked for six years in the Guild of Handicraft run by CR Ashbee in Chipping Campden, and then worked there as an independent carver and sculptor in stone and wood until he emigrated with his family to America in 1939. He died and was buried in Kent.

He carved a great deal of work for churches, and many War Memorials after the First World War. He also carved about 600 portrait sculptures, all in wood - his favourite material, and much external and internal decorative work. He exhibited at the Royal Academy show for a number of years.
