

By the time you read this, the Olympic Games will be fading from your memory, but as I write, we're in the midst of all the excitement! Team GB has won a number of gold medals in really exciting contests - the men's mountain biking, the women's

quadruple sculls, and the men's triathlon all come to mind. And the individuals and teams concerned can inspire us all, in Tom Pidcock's words, never to give up. He'd been forced to withdraw from the Tour de France a couple of weeks earlier, as he'd contracted Covid. In the Olympic mountain bike race, he had to

fight his way back to the front of the race after his bike had a puncture shortly before the halfway point. The women's rowing team were in second place for much of their race, but overtook the Dutch boat as they crossed the finish line.

In the triathlon, Alex Yee was 14 seconds behind the leader at the beginning of the final lap of the run, and really struggling, but as he said, 'I didn't give up,' and 400 metres before the end of the race, he took the lead and went on to win.

'Never give up' doesn't mean that we should always plough on, regardless of circumstances. The American gymnast Simone Biles made the wise decision to pull out of the Tokyo Olympics when she realised that she needed to put her own mental health first, and take care of herself. There are times when we all need to take a step back, and take stock, before going ahead once more, possibly in a different direction. As I write, Simone Biles has won a team gold medal in Paris, and she's expected to do great

things in the individual women's competitions.

Christians can learn a great deal from sportspeople; the writer of the letter to the Hebrews in the New Testament of the Bible pictures us as competitors in an athletics stadium, cheered on by all the Christian believers who have gone



before us. They urge us to run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus... If you are a Christian, be inspired by our Olympians, and by those who have gone before us, not to give up. If you'd like to explore what it might mean for you, please make a start by talking it over with a Christian friend and/or joining us for a Church service sometime very soon.



St Mary's Tower Roof Repairs

The tower roof of St Mary's Church has been leaking for some time, it was only when the bell work was carried out that it became clear how much damage had been done by the water ingress. The



repair was clearly a priority and this will go ahead from 19th August for approximately two months. The work needs scaffolding, so that it can be done safely and this will go up outside of the tower. At the same time a lightning conductor is being installed and some masonry at the top of the tower is being stabilised. The work will cost over £57,000 and is being

mostly funded by a generous legacy from David Buckeridge. There was hope of getting a grant so that more work could be carried out, but the application was unsuccessful. This means that the work that is being done is that which is essential rather than including some that would be desirable.


