Peace On Earth

Dear Friends,

*Peace on Earth can it be?
Years from now, perhaps we'll see?

Can it be?*


These words were sung by David Bowie in his Christmas duet with Bing Crosby in December 1977 (released as a single in 1982). Listening to reports of the appalling situation in the Holy Land, and mindful of the continuing conflict in Ukraine as well as many other parts of the world, the sentiment expressed in the song seems even more pertinent to the world today.



Scripture entreats us to “Pray for the peace of Jerusalem” (Psalm 122: 6), the city whose name itself means “God’s peace”, yet it is questionable whether Jerusalem has ever truly known peace having been fought over throughout its history. This is the city that Jesus himself wept over as He observed it from the Mount of Olives (Luke 19: 41 - 42).

In the coming months our thoughts turn towards the celebration of the One who, amongst other names, is called the Prince of Peace. In our preparation through Advent we will also focus on the prospect of His awaited return in Glory ... at which time we are told He will finally bring the “Peace on earth and goodwill to all people on whom God’s favour rests” as promised by the angels announcing His birth (Luke 2: 14).

In the meantime, what are we to do? We may be powerless to directly influence events in the Middle East, or elsewhere, but we can and should pray to the One who ultimately holds all things in His hands. Trusting that one day, in His time, the world will indeed know peace as we see the Day of Glory.

There are many people and situations which need regular, sustained prayer. Here are just some of them.


Please remember especially:-

## **Christingle**

On December 10<sup>th</sup> we will be having lots of fun Christmas activities, including making Christingles for ourselves and for the congregation. We will then go into Church for the **Christingle Service** (*which will include a collection for The Children's Society*), followed by a Christmas Tea in the North Room.

### **What is Christingle?**

Christingle is a joyful celebration that brings families and communities together to share the light of Jesus and spread a message of hope. Christingles are oranges wrapped in red tape, decorated with dried fruit or sweets with a candle in the middle.

The Orange represents the world

The red ribbon or tape symbolises the love and blood of Christ

The sweets and dried fruit represent the fruits of the earth and the four sticks represent the four seasons and the compass points

The candle represents Jesus – light of the world



Here at **Holy Trinity, Messy Church** usually meets on alternate months, on a Sunday from 4.00pm — 6.00pm.

# Christ the King



Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> November is the last Sunday in the Church liturgical year which follows the life of Christ from his conception and birth at Christmas, His crucifixion and His rising from the dead at Easter, to being recognised as Christ the King.

He is a different King from worldly kings and governments. He must reign in our minds, in our wills, in our hearts, and in our bodies. He is the king of all nations and of all people who choose to accept Him into their lives and who allow the Holy Spirit to not only be within them but to work through them.

This Sunday is also known as 'Stir up Sunday' from the first words of the collect:

Stir up, O Lord, the wills of your faithful people, that they bringing forth the fruit of good works, may by you be richly rewarded: through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen

It has always been associated with Christmas puddings. The great cry 'stir up' was a reminder to congregations to get the Christmas pudding made in plenty of time to mature before Christmas. However, the prayer is actually asking God for something much more important. We are praying that God will stir up our wills, so that we might get on with doing the good works that He has planned for us to do.

The gospel reading from Matthew on this Sunday tells of the end of time when all will be judged by Jesus. Jesus uses the image of a shepherd who sorts out the sheep from the goats, so there will be a separation of people who have done good things and people who have failed to do good. (Matthew 25; 31 - end)

The good news is that the challenge which Jesus gives can be fulfilled by anybody. Jesus simply tells His followers to be kind to one another. Look after the poor, visit the sick, give food to the hungry. We can all do this, and so we become a part of God's family. When Christ the King comes to judge the world at the End Times will He be able to say to us 'Well done good and faithful servant'?



Mothers' Union has launched their new campaign **RISE UP** Against Domestic Abuse Campaign. Through its 40,000 strong membership across Britain and Ireland, Mothers' Union aims to play its part in combating domestic abuse through awareness raising, resources, and support for those affected by domestic abuse, as well as fostering a culture of empathy and empowerment within our churches and communities.

**RISE UP** is an acronym for **R**espond, **I**nform, **S**upport, **E**mpower, **U**nite and **P**ray. Participants of the challenge are able to achieve bronze, silver or gold awards based on their involvement of the challenge. To achieve a bronze award, churches or branches should:

- Download a poster from Mothers' Union's website about domestic abuse with details of their local domestic abuse helpline and display it in public places such as churches, community centres and public toilets.
- Commit to pray for those affected by domestic abuse, including victims, survivors, perpetrators and those who work in the field of domestic abuse
- Make connections with local domestic abuse support organisations and offer support based on their needs.

Hundreds of Mothers' Union members across the UK and Ireland, including Holy Trinity, have committed to take part in the challenge.

Rochester Cathedral is hosting a short service with the Mothers' Union at 1:00pm on 25<sup>th</sup> of November to pray for victims and survivors of Domestic Abuse. The service will begin with a minute's silence at 1:03pm to remember the victims who have not survived. After prayers, those attending will proceed out of the Cathedral to the Catalpa Tree to tie purple ribbons on the fencing as a reminder of our need to stand with those who suffer abuse and bring healing.

Here at Holy Trinity we will pray for victims and survivors and will also have a Red Chair display, purple ribbons, and purple and white cranes, so keep an eye out.

## Book Review

### One Last Thing: How to live with the end in mind by Wendy Mitchell Bloomsbury 2023

This is the third book by Wendy. The first two were 'Somebody I used to know' and 'What I wish people knew about dementia' based on her experience of living with dementia. In the review of the latter one, in the summer magazine, I emphasised her positive view on life. This attitude also pervades this book about preparing for death.

In 'One last thing' she says ' what keeps me going is hope - hope that tomorrow will be a better day, hope that just as I have been able to adapt to life with a progressive illness, I will be able to adapt to life with the end in mind;'

She explores all angles of death: how we talk about it with our loved ones and how we can be empowered to make our own choices. She tackles straightforward subjects such as Power of Attorney, but also more difficult topics such as refusing treatment and assisted dying. She reminds all of us, with or without a progressive illness, that to get on with the business of living , we need to talk about death.

## **White Chocolate Bread Pudding**

With colder weather now arrived, thoughts turn to warm, comforting food, and a good pudding is usually welcome at the end of a family dinner. Here is a recipe my family enjoy – based on a traditional bread and butter pudding, but richer and nice for an occasional treat.

200 ml (7fl oz) whole milk  
200 ml (7fl oz) double cream  
1/2 tsp vanilla extract  
1 medium egg  
2 medium egg yolks  
50gr (2 oz) caster sugar  
200gr (8 oz) brioche loaf or rolls, sliced  
25 - 50gr (1-2 oz) white chocolate to taste, finely chopped  
50gr (2 oz) fresh or frozen raspberries  
Icing sugar to dust

Put the milk, cream and vanilla into a pan. Bring just to the boil then take off the heat.

Beat together the whole egg, yolks and caster sugar. Gradually add the hot milk mixture, whisking constantly.

Arrange the brioche in an ovenproof dish, overlapping the slices. Dot around the white chocolate and raspberries. Carefully pour over the custard mixture, press down lightly on the bread to immerse, and leave to soak for around 20 minutes.

Heat the oven to 160C (140C fan). Bake for 25-30 minutes or until the custard is just set. Dust with icing sugar and serve. Serves 4.
