Not suitable for those under 3 years due to small parts). Please follow the current Government guidelines at all times whilst doing the trail.

Churches to look for:

These are in no special order and you only need to find 10 to get a goody bag (you can challenge yourself to find them all if you want though!). When you find the picture in the window write down the number of the picture is next to the name of the church.

Coventry Cathedral, Priory Street, CV1 5FB

Earlsdon Methodist Church, 227 Albany Road, CV5 6NF


Being on the corner by Earlsdon roundabout makes us very visible, watch out for posters about our current activities or visit our website (www.earlsdonmethodist.org.uk).

We thought you might appreciate some activities to do - these are an extra, they're not part of the trail.


1) Find the words in the wordsearch.

Light Word Search




2) Can you find your way through the pumpkin maze?
