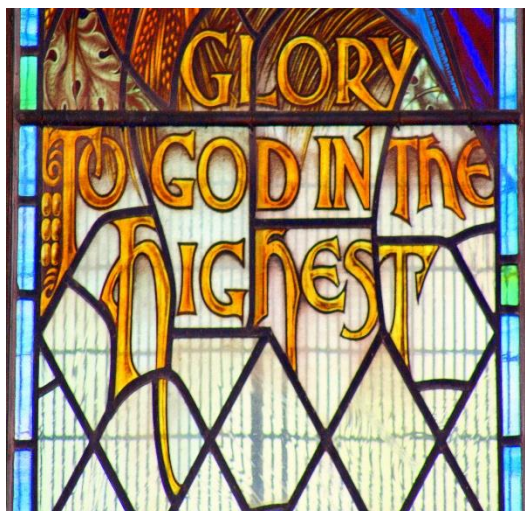


Morning Prayer

Bible Reading

*You may wish to say Psalm 23
or the Psalm set for the day.*

Psalm 23

¹ The Lord is my shepherd; ♦
therefore can I lack nothing.

² He makes me lie down
in green pastures ♦
and leads me beside still waters.

³ He shall refresh my soul ♦
and guide me in the paths of
righteousness for his name's sake.

⁴ Though I walk through the valley
of the shadow of death,
I will fear no evil; ♦
for you are with me; your rod
and your staff, they comfort me.

⁵ You spread a table before me
in the presence
of those who trouble me; ♦
you have anointed my head with oil
and my cup shall be full.

⁶ Surely goodness and loving mercy
shall follow me all the days of my life, ♦
and I will dwell
in the house of the Lord for ever.
**Glory to the Father and to the Son
and to the Holy Spirit;**
**as it was in the beginning is now
and shall be for ever. Amen**

Sunday

But now thus says the Lord,

the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour.

Monday

*'Do not let your hearts be troubled.
Believe in God, believe also in me.
In my Father's house there are
many dwelling-places. If it were not
so, would I have told you that I go to
prepare a place for you?
And if I go
and prepare a place for you,
I will come again and will take you to
myself, so that where I am, there
you may be also. And you know the
way to the place where I am going.'*

Thomas said to him,
'Lord, we
do not know where you are going.
How can we know the way?'

Jesus said to him,
'I am the way, and the truth,
and the life. No one comes to the
Father except through me.'

John 14.1-6

Tuesday

Finally, beloved, whatever is true,
whatever is honourable,
whatever is just, whatever is pure,
whatever is pleasing,
whatever is commendable,
if there is any excellence and
if there is anything worthy of praise,
think about these things.
Keep on doing the things that you
have learned and received
and heard and seen in me, and
the God of peace will be with you.

Wednesday

Let the word of Christ
dwell in you richly; teach and
admonish one another in all wisdom;
and with gratitude in your hearts
sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual
songs to God. And whatever you do,
in word or deed, do everything in the
name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks
to God the Father through him.

Colossians 3.16,17

Thursday

You are no longer
strangers and aliens, but you are
citizens with the saints and also
members of the household of God,
built upon the foundation of the
apostles and prophets, with Christ
Jesus himself as the cornerstone.
In him the whole structure is
joined together and grows into a
holy temple in the Lord; in whom
you also are built together spiritually
into a dwelling-place for God.

Ephesians 2.19-22

Friday

Let love be genuine; hate what is
evil, hold fast to what is good; love

one another with mutual affection;
outdo one another in showing honour.
Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit,
serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope,
be patient in suffering,
persevere in prayer.

Romans 19.9-12

Saturday

Jesus said to his disciples,
*'Therefore I tell you, do not worry
about your life, what you will eat, or
about your body, what you will wear.
For life is more than food,
and the body more than clothing.
Consider the ravens: they neither
sow nor reap, they have neither
storehouse nor barn, and yet God
feeds them. Of how much more
value are you than the birds!*

*And can any of you by worrying add
a single hour to your span of life?
If then you are not able to
do so small a thing as that,
why do you worry about the rest?*

*Consider the lilies, how they grow:
they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell
you, even Solomon in all his glory
was not clothed like one of these.
But if God so clothes the grass of
the field, which is alive today and
tomorrow is thrown into the oven,
how much more will he clothe you -
you of little faith!*

*And do not keep striving for what
you are to eat and what you are to
drink, and do not keep worrying.
For it is the nations of the world that
strive after all these things, and your
Father knows that you need them.
Instead, strive for his kingdom,
and these things
will be given to you as well.*

Luke 12.22-31

Keep us from falling into sin or
running into danger; order us in all
our doings and guide us to do
always what is righteous in your
sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

brought low; that we may rejoice in
your comfort knowing that nothing
can separate us from your love in
Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen**

Bible Reading

or another chosen psalm.*

Psalm 91

- ¹ Whoever dwells
in the shelter of the Most High ♦
and abides
under the shadow of the Almighty,
- ² Shall say to the Lord,
'My refuge and my stronghold, ♦
my God, in whom I put my trust.'
- ³ For he shall deliver you
from the snare of the fowler ♦
and from the deadly pestilence.
- ⁴ He shall cover you with his wings
and you shall be
safe under his feathers; ♦
his faithfulness
shall be your shield and buckler.
- ⁵ You shall not be afraid
of any terror by night, ♦
nor of the arrow that flies by day;
- ⁶ Of the pestilence
that stalks in darkness, ♦
nor of the sickness
that destroys at noonday.
- ⁷ Though a thousand fall at your side
and ten thousand at your right hand, ♦
yet it shall not come near you.
- ⁸ Your eyes have only to behold ♦
to see the reward of the wicked.

⁹ Because you have made
the Lord your refuge ♦
and the Most High your stronghold,

¹⁰ There shall no evil happen to you, ♦
neither shall any plague
come near your tent.

¹¹ For he shall give his angels
charge over you, ♦
to keep you in all your ways.

¹² They shall bear you in their hands, ♦
lest you
dash your foot against a stone.

¹³ You shall
tread upon the lion and adder; ♦
the young lion and the serpent
you shall trample underfoot.

¹⁴ Because they have
set their love upon me,
therefore will I deliver them; ♦
I will lift them up,
because they know my name.

¹⁵ They will call upon me
and I will answer them; ♦
I am with them in trouble,
I will deliver them
and bring them to honour.

¹⁶ With long life will I satisfy them ♦
and show them my salvation.
