Dear St. Matthew's Church Family,

Now that it looks like we'll be restricted in our social contacts for some time to come, we're moving into a long term, different way of doing things. We'll keep thinking about how best to support you as we move forwards, but please do let us know any of your ideas. We can't promise to implement them all, but they will enrich the conversation and help us to discern what we are able to undertake.

This morning, as I said Morning Prayer, a verse from the letter of James really jumped out at me.

*Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him. James 1:12*

What has been for you the greatest frustration of this present trial? For some it is the sadness of loss, for others the worry of sickness. Whilst it might seem trivial, for many it is the lack of physical contact. A hug can communicate more on an emotional level than many words on the phone. A visit to the bedside of a sick friend brings healing to both, even when one will not survive. Loads that we would carry together with ease seem to grow heavier when we attempt to carry them alone. Contact for now is severely restricted, and that is hard to bear.

Whilst James wasn't thinking about the enforced isolation of a pandemic when he wrote these words, I believe the promise holds true for us today. Having persevered in living for the Lord in whatever trials we are called upon to face, we will receive fullness of life now and into eternity. So in these difficult days, stick close to Jesus and let us know how we can help you in that.
