PASTORAL MUSING

Managing the Challenge of Change

By the time you read this, we would be well into January **2020**! By the end of the year, I hope and pray we may all enjoy 2020 perfect vision of the plans and purposes of God!

Our future as always, is unmapped and unknown; we can, therefore, have only an out-of-focus understanding of the future. As I started writing this, my heart skipped a beat - on the 26th January we shall inaugurate and dedicate our new Church building, to the Glory of God! It has been a long journey from late 2002 when we first mooted the idea of a new church building, much to the consternation of some; back it the future was indeed out-of-focus!

Well, here we are, about to enter the new building, which is truly a gift from our loving and caring God. Hindsight they say is 2020 vision! One day, I hope someone might read through the volumes of correspondence and paperwork, to discover and write about the hand of God taking us through every twist and turn in our journey. With every ounce of honesty I can muster, I make this declaration: without the wisdom of God, the diligent and meticulous project management by Jesus Christ to whom we the Church belong, and the guidance and direction by the Holy Spirit, the physical structure by which we are identified as a Church, would not have been possible.

Planning our move into the new building and organise new beginnings reminds of a room in our home, the smallest of three bedrooms in a “bog-standard 3-bed English semi”, which occasionally goes through a thorough clean-**out** (not just a “clean”!), to get rid of things no longer required, used nor needed.



If the prospect of change unnerves or unsettles you, then read with me, the first four verses of the third chapter of Paul's letter to the Church at Colosse (Colossians), which challenge us as God's children, to **retain** some things of

real value, to **release** everything we are attached to which can easily become a millstone around our necks, and to **remember** with joy, the pleasure of having had and enjoyed everything being discarded.

Paul starts by telling the church, to **retain** the following:

- hold firm to the Truth that you have been “raised to new life with Christ”, because *Jesus is the only one who conquered death into new (resurrected) life, and invites us to be a part of His new life* (Colossians 1:15);
- focus your mind to continually seek the realities of Heaven: a deeper knowledge of Jesus (3:10), living a Holy life (3:5-9), acquiring Godly virtues (3:12-17), enjoying Holiness in our home and social lives (3:18-4:1), building an effective prayer life (4:2) and establishing a fruitful witness (4:3-6).



Then **release** things which have attached themselves to our lives, that inflict damage, like **false doctrine** which draws us away from Truth, philosophies based on **human wisdom and traditions**, made by society (*just because*

we have done it, and continue to do it, doesn't make it proper and True).

Finally, there is a pile of things which should be **discarded**, things which are no longer important, significant or have value to us, things which no longer make sense to anyone but ourselves.

Paul wants us to grasp this Truth, if we have *new life in Christ*, then a “death” must have taken place. True! We have died to all that has no significance nor importance to our new life in Christ, and should, therefore, with careful thought and consideration, be either retained, released or disposed off, with a thankful memory of having been a blessing in the past.

As we stand here on the cusp of a New Year, with the added excitement of entering into, and using our new church building, and the all the promise of God's blessings this holds, may God give us 2020 vision to prayerfully release that which is neither relevant nor important, including things which have deceived us into believing they are significant, and retain that which has value in the kingdom of God. Finally, let's dispose off all that is no longer relevant. These have had their time and served their purpose, but they should not be left around to distract us from the future God has planned for us!

Amen? Yes, **AMEN!**

Don't forget that Sunday 12th, January is not only the Church Meeting, but also the last Sunday service in the present building.


