REFLECTION

By the time you read this, the turkey will be just a carcass (or even soup) and the presents will have been unwrapped and normality will almost have been restored. One of the problems of all the special events happening before Christmas is that after the day itself, everything seems flat.

But there are 12 days of Christmas, or even 40 if you want to be really old-fashioned with it not finishing till Candlemas on 2 February. And, of course, the reason for this is that as Christians we need time to take in the enormity of what happened on that first Christmas. Here is the God who created and sustains not just the earth and us humans, but the whole universe, becoming one of us in the person of a human child.

At Epiphany we celebrate the fact that this was done not just for His chosen people the Jews, but for each and every one of us here on earth. We need time to reflect on this, which is indeed a 'great and mighty wonder', in the words of the carol. This act of sheer love on the part of our God demands a response from us.

It is annual habit for many to make New Year's Resolutions, a lot of which will fall by the wayside within days or weeks, but every year our resolution ought to be to look at and seek ways to enhance our faith and what it means for us in terms of action in response to God's overwhelming act of love in the Incarnation. Share in full each year. Our Parish Share for 2024 is £56,161. This is roughly £1,000 a year for each adult worshipper on a Sunday. In addition we have to raise around £35,000 for the day to day expenses of running this church. So, again, thank you all so much.

The Gift Aid that we are able to claim on Gift Aided donations makes a significant contribution to church finances.

ECO CHURCH

We are delighted to announce that just before Christmas we were awarded Silver Eco Award. So many people have worked towards this at home and in the church community.

Research and coordination of our heating project has resulted in us halving our carbon generation, our parish energy buying is a green supplier. Our PCC and finance team enabled our banking to be ethical with the Cooperative Bank. Our grounds continue to be cared for with native plants, fruit trees and vegetables with a small team, donations of plants, our children's and uniformed groups helping with bug hotels and bird feeding. A congregation member took part in a climate consultation with Trafford. We have links with our church school Eco team.

All of this has been alongside worship, hymns, and prayer in services, shared online, in newsletters and in family eco activity days. A particular thanks for the 'fiddly recycling' when we keep items separate at church tea / biscuit times and after functions and then

take it home to our own bins Also thanks for the car sharing, candle recycling, walking and cycling and all each of you do in your own way to care for God's World and help nature to re build for the climate for generations to come.
