REFLECTION

The Divine Artist

I have always had a huge admiration for people who can draw. I don't know the first thing about drawing or painting but I enjoy the way in which a drawing or a painting takes shape over time. In the image below we can see how the drawing begins with a few marks and lines. It's an outline of what will follow. If we could only see the image on the left, it would be hard to imagine how it would look when completed. The middle image gives more definition, but it's only in the final image on the right that we marvel at the completed work.



Our journey as Christians begins with Baptism, and it's as if in Baptism God begins the work of making an outline of who we will become in Christ. Just as a pencil artist begins with a rough sketch, so our journey as Christians begins with an outline of what we have the potential to become in Christ. We are all made in the image of God but the likeness of God is something we need to grow into. In baptism we begin the process of growing in God's likeness. With the prayers and support of the Christian community we make a start. We allow the divine artist to add shade and definition to our humanity. It's as if we are moving from the image on the left towards the middle image.

A second, really important, part of the divine work happens at Confirmation. Here God 'makes firm' the grace we received in baptism. It's as if God adds even more definition to who we are in Christ. We could think of the middle image as a moment when the artist 'confirms' all that's gone before and prepares for all that will follow afterwards. On 8th June at 10.30am at St. Clement's, and on 22nd June at 6.30pm at St. Mary's, nine candidates from our parishes will be confirmed by Bishop Mark. This will be a moment for them when God will confirm and

strengthen them as they continue to grow as disciples of Jesus.

Each of us are called by God to let God give shape and definition to our humanity. None of us really knows where we are on the journey but God can help us to grow. In the resurrection we will fully reflect the image and likeness of God. In the meantime God calls us to let him work at helping us to grow and mature as disciples of Jesus.

Part of letting God add more and more definition and shade to our humanity involves giving God opportunities to shape our humanity. Just as a person sitting for a portrait has to sit still to let the artist capture their essence, God calls us to give God time and space to shape our characters. Time spent in prayer, time spent in woship, time reading the scritpures are all times where we allow the divine artist to shape us. This then makes our active lives so much more fruitful, because our activities flow from God, not from our own anxiety, or need to be needed or busy.

Please pray for our confirmation candidates: Emily, Debbie, Joseph, Nicholas, Rachelle, Demi, Holly, Joe and Kara, that they will continue to grow in Christ. Pray too for one another, that we can all continue growing in the likeness of Christ.
