## **REFLECTION**

Every time we attend the Eucharist, we say that we believe in the Communion of Saints, and at the end of the preface to the eucharistic prayer, the priest says the words '....therefore with angels, archangels, and all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, forever praising you and saying......'. It is an integral part of the Christian faith that we believe that we are united in our prayer and praise with all our brothers and sisters in Christ who have gone before us.

November brings us to the time of year when this focus on the whole church, militant here on earth, and triumphant in heaven, come to the fore. We start with the wonderful Feast of All Saints on 1 November. On this day, we concentrate on and give thanks for all those Christians who have inspired the whole church by the example of their faith. As well as the known ones who have their own feasts in the calendar, there are many who inspired others, but whose names are not generally known, and it's our opportunity to celebrate their lives.

The following day (2 November – All Souls Day), we commemorate all those whom we have loved in this life, but who are now at rest in Our Blessed Lord's loving arms. We believe that death has been overcome by the Resurrection of Jesus, and so we remember our departed loved ones by name and join our prayers with theirs, rejoicing in this triumph over death, and giving thanks for God's grace.

On 8 November, we remember particularly our English saints and martyrs, of which there are many, known and unknown. Lastly, of course, on 11 November and on the Sunday nearest to it, we remember those who have given their lives in war and in the service of freedom.

All this may sound a bit daunting, especially as we face a few months of long dark nights and cold weather. However, rejoice – Jesus has promised us He is with us till the end of time (Matthew 28:20), and with the penitent thief and all those who believe, in God's good time we shall be with the Risen Christ in Paradise (Luke 23:43).
