
## Wanted - your prayer requests and ideas

## Getting out and about

Good news for everyone, especially those of us self-isolating, is that the National Trust, whilst closing visitor centres, cafés and other buildings, are keeping gardens and parks open to everyone for free. Locally, Standen and Sheffield Park will be open 10am to 5pm daily. Nymans is closed this weekend and will then be open daily from 12-4pm. Wakehurst has free



parking and entry to the gardens from 10am to 6pm. Last entry is half an hour before closing in all cases. It's probably a good idea to check websites before going as things could change as time goes along. For keen birders wanting to keep up with the Spring arrivals, RSPB reserves, such as Pulborough Brooks, will also be open, with visitor centres and cafés closed. Again, probably best to check websites. Tilgate Park is open except for the Nature Centre.
