

## **Found – Psalm 23 / John 10:11-18**

This morning is the Thanksgiving and Dedication service for Paige Elise Meakins. It's a time for us all to give thanks to God for her safe arrival and pledge our support to Ollie and Hannah as they dedicate themselves to the challenging, rewarding and important work of parenting.

As we do so, we'll remind ourselves of the love God has for us as we look at one of the greatest treasures we've received from the ancient world. Before Homer wrote the *Iliad*, before Socrates and Plato were born, over two centuries before Rome was founded, the words of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm were being read, recited and heard in Jerusalem.



For three subsequent millennia these words have been taught to children, set to music, whispered to (and by) the dying. Though often taken for granted, they are a treasure for every new generation of believers. We'll look at their simple message this morning and see together a beautiful, though hidden, signpost to the identity and ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ.

- Do you feel equipped to clearly explain the good news about Jesus?
- Do you have a gospel outline in your head to help you? What are the main points?
- Find a friend and practise explaining the gospel to each other in one minute. It will help to have 4 main points clear in your mind. Give each other feedback on what was strong and what might need sharpening.

Finally, spend some time in prayer:

- Thank God that He is Creator and Redeemer.
- Ask Him to help you to live a life of repentance, continually turning away from sinful ways.
- Ask God to lead people around you to Himself and to give you opportunities to explain the greatest life-changing gift in the world - the gospel of Jesus Christ.

# PRAYER DIARY: 29<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER - 5<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER

## PSALM 5

**Monday** “<sup>1</sup> Listen to my words, LORD, consider my lament.<sup>2</sup> Hear my cry for help, my King and my God, for to You I pray.” Today, let us draw alongside in prayer those we know who have been bereaved, or are dealing with illness or disability, and those giving 24-hour care to loved ones. These words from Psalm 5 must be their heart’s cry for each day.

**Tuesday** “<sup>3</sup> In the morning, LORD, You hear my voice, in the morning I lay my requests before You and wait expectantly.” Praise God whose ear is always open to our cry, and answers. May He help us to hear His voice. Besides our own requests, let us lay before God the 19 people attending the Alpha course, and all those helping. May all involved know that God will hear them too.

**Wednesday** “<sup>7</sup> But I, by Your great love, can come into Your house; in reverence I bow down towards Your holy temple.” Praise our precious Heavenly Father that we are able to gather together again in worship each Sunday. Please also spend time praying His blessing on all the weekday activities that take place on the church premises each week, and His anointing on the leadership of the different groups.

**Thursday** “<sup>8</sup> Lead me, LORD, in Your righteousness because of my enemies make Your way straight before me.” Praise God for all the families, children and young people connected with VBC. As we thank God for them, and those young people at university, please pray passionately that God will lead each of them, making their way straight before them, and giving them faith, strength and wisdom to hold fast to that righteous path in spite of the pressures.

**Friday** “<sup>11</sup> But let all who take refuge in You be glad; let them ever sing for joy. Spread Your protection over them, that those who love Your name may rejoice in You.” Praise The Lord for the VBC family He has given us, for the Life Groups to which we belong and each member in our groups; as well as for our earthly families. Let us thank God for all who have taken refuge in Him; pray for His protection over them all, and seek His face on behalf of all who have yet to enjoy that relationship with God through Jesus. May God help us all to love Him, rejoice in His name, and sing for joy in all circumstances; bringing our sacrifice of praise.

**FUEL FOR PRAYER**

**Saturday** <sup>12</sup>“Surely, LORD, You bless the righteous; You surround them with Your favour as with a shield.” Praise God for every experience of His blessings and protection. As it is Hanukah, and today the Jewish Sabbath, with anti-Semitism on the rise as it was before WW2, let us pray for the Lord to shield the Jewish people in the UK and around the world, and pray for the peace of Jerusalem. We can be thankful for the 30,000 Messianic believers in Israel, made righteous in Jesus as their Messiah, and those who are making the New Testament available online and in print. Praise God for the many congregations where Jews, Arabic peoples, and Gentiles, all worship God together in Israel in freedom. May God surround them with His favour as with a shield, anointing His truth as people hear or read the New Testament, bringing many more to the saving knowledge of Jesus.

**Sunday** Heb9:28 <sup>“28</sup>Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait for Him, He will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salvation.” With the convergence of so many Biblical prophecies, we praise God for our salvation, and the prospect of Jesus’ second coming. As God’s word is taught in church today, we pray that all who hear are being prepared as the pure bride of Christ, knowing our sins are forgiven, and using what we hear to purify our lives as we wait expectantly for Jesus’ second coming.




We have had the great news recently of three of Helen's CAP clients becoming debt-free. Some have asked what is the process behind it all and these notes give us an idea of what is involved.



## ETHIOPIA - A PARCHED LAND

A quiz question for you. Which is the second most populous country on the continent of Africa? It is Ethiopia. To quote a former prime minister agreeing to the dismemberment of Czechoslovakia before the outbreak of the Second World War, 'A far away country of which we know nothing!' Today we should know that Ethiopia is at the heart of the climate crisis which has been occupying our thoughts and prayers these past weeks. The failure of the rains has left the land a parched desert which has to support a burgeoning population of some 115 million people with a dangerous and growing armed conflict.



We are familiar with its early evangelisation following the conversion and baptism of the Ethiopian eunuch returning home from the feast in Jerusalem and sitting in his chariot reading the prophecy of Isaiah, foretelling the suffering and death of Jesus whom the Lord has made an offering for sin. Today, the Ethiopian Orthodox church has a key to the salvation of the land. Over the past century, 90% of the forests have been lost, those that remain are those that surround the churches.



Preserved as an act of faith for centuries, these forests are testimony to the power of faith to create sustainable landscapes, demarcated by a stark boundary wall between sacred and secular, church and field, work and rest.

For these Coptic Christians the symbol of the tree is at the heart of the Christian story from the tree of life in the Garden of Eden in Genesis to its redemptive role in Revelation by the river of life and bearing fruit and leaves for the healing of the nations. Today each church forest is seen by its guardians as a miniature Eden, vital for the survival of human life. Its religious significance only equalled by its ecological importance. The vast church forest network covers an area the size of England.

My source is Kieran Dodds, who tells the story of these sacred oases in his book 'The Church Forests of Ethiopia' available from the 15<sup>th</sup> November. I reflect on how blinkered are some secular scientists who are finding our origins in the sun! Didn't pagan religions do that! I am not qualified to debate with them but rather join the worshipping throng singing with heart and voice in the words of the great Russian hymn ... 'O Lord my God, When I in awesome wonder, consider all the works Thy hand hath made, I see the stars, I hear the mighty thunder, Thy power throughout the universe displayed. Then sings my soul, my Saviour God to Thee, how great Thou Art, How great Thou art' (Translation by Stuart Hine)

Read again Isaiah 53:7,8, Genesis 2:9, Revelation 22:1,2
