## A letter from Rev Joy 16 January 2022 Second Sunday after Epiphany

I drafted this letter in longhand on the train to London on Friday. It was a bright and chilly morning and there was still frost on the fields. I saw a solitary heron between Hampden Park and Eastbourne and it reminded me how excited Clem gets when she sees one. They are very special birds—a bit like

owls in their inscrutability. Felicity at Guestling gave me a very useful calendar for Christmas illustrated with her own photographs, one of which has two herons side by side—a rare sight indeed! It's been a week for travelling as yesterday Dawn, Neil and I were joined by David and Valerie, Fairlight's Churchwardens, for lunch with the Archdeacon at his home in Crowborough. Sadly Kathy couldn't join us as she was still



waiting to test negative for Covid. I think the meeting went well and got things moving. More details will be forthcoming soon once all the PCCs have been fully informed of the process and timeline that has been provisionally agreed. I think train travel is the closest to riding a bike that I will ever come to as, even after 2 years of going nowhere, the feel of it and the confidence comes back very quickly. In my 20s I was a student commuter to Charing Cross as I studied for my first degree at Kings College in the Strand. In my 40s I repeated that exercise for 2 years as I studied for my MA at Kings again. Then in my 60s I did a year's pre-ordination training at SEITE with classes based at Southwark Cathedral . The station for

that was London Bridge and it meant late evening travel back to Hastings all through the winter with a bus service from Tunbridge Wells—those were the days!

Returning home to the Sussex coast after both my journeys, I was amazed at the beauty of the sky and the sea. The sea was an icy pale blue and as flat and still as the proverbial mill pond. The sky and the rising sea mist were coloured a beautiful rosy gold as they reflected the glorious sunset in the west. It was a lovely welcome home for this traveller! Fifty-eight people from Anglican churches across Sussex were commissioned as Authorised Lay Ministers, by Bishop Ruth at a special service in Chichester Cathedral on Saturday 8th January, the third year the event has been held.



Authorised Lay Ministers share in the public ministry of the local church, as they serve their local parishes. The Revd Jayne Prestwood, Officer for Lay Vocation and Ministry, runs the lay ministry training programme. She said: "It is wonderful to mark the start of the Year by commissioning the Authorised Lay Ministers. Authorised Lay Ministry is now recognised across the Church of England as a vibrant and growing expression of lay ministry. I am delighted that we will be expanding our ALM training programme further to provide flexible and affordable skills-based training in a variety of different ministries."






## The Chichester Nativity
