The Rector Writes:-

This July sees the 13th anniversary of Jenny's and my ordination as Deacons at Chester cathedral. The date was 4th July, often known by our transatlantic cousins as Independence Day, and the irony was not lost on me: on the day other celebrated independence, we were pledging ourselves to a life a service!



The role of the Deacon is described in the ordination service in these terms:

Deacons are called to work with the Bishop and the priests with whom they serve as heralds of Christ's kingdom. They are to proclaim the gospel in word and deed, as agents of God's purposes of love. They are to serve the community in which they are set, bringing to the Church the needs and hopes of all the people. They are to work with their fellow members in searching out the poor and weak, the sick and lonely and those who are oppressed and powerless, reaching into the forgotten corners of the world, that the love of God may be made visible. Deacons share in the pastoral ministry of the Church and in leading God's people in worship. They preach the word and bring the needs of the world before the Church in intercession. They accompany those searching for faith and bring them to baptism. They assist in administering the sacraments; they distribute communion and minister to the sick and housebound.

The role of the Deacon is one of service – to God, and to God's people. Amidst all the pomposity and self-importance which church life encourages in ordained ministers, the ministry of a Deacon is a very necessary puncturing of that; it is a reminder that at its heart, ministry is about serving others, in imitation of Jesus, the servant-king, who took off his outer robe to wash the feet of the disciples before his own death.

It's also a role that is complimentary – it's about teamwork; notice in those paragraphs the abundance of words associated with working together: *work with/share/accompany/assist*. Being a Deacon is about being part of something bigger than just yourself. Before being ordained, the bishop reminds the prospective Deacons:

You cannot bear the weight of this calling in your own strength, but only by the grace and power of God.

That is certainly not a bad thing to be reminded of! The need for God's help in all of tasks of life and ministry. Your ordination does not turn you into superwoman or superman, as much as you or others might think it!!

While many people ordained as Deacon then are ordained a year later as a priest, there are some ministers who don't and they remain as 'Distinctive Deacons'.

Much has happened since that sweltering day in July 2010, both for us as a family, and of course in the world around us. But one thing remains the same – we are still Deacons. This was something impressed upon us at our ordination retreat leading up to the service, as well as during our first year of curacy: despite whatever happens afterwards (whether one goes on to be ordained as a priest, or rises to different roles within the Church hierarchy, or even if one is consecrated as a bishop), you still remain a Deacon. That never changes: you don't grow out of it! Instead, service is the bedrock of the role of the clergy.

I admit that I don't always succeed in this. It is easy to say 'that's not my job or what I'm here to do' when faced with apparently mundane or trivial jobs; but it is often in the stacking of chairs, the making of refreshments, joining in with the upkeep of the graveyard that the serving nature of Deacons is expressed, as we realise that we don't labour alone but part of a wider team, and it is in those moments that we follow in the footsteps of our servant-Saviour, Jesus. So I am also very thankful this anniversary of those in the parish who remind me of the Diaconal nature of ministry, as they perform those simple, often overlooked or untrumpeted tasks. Thank you for your service, and may we continue to be a community of deacons in this parish!

Also, for the final half-term of the year, Revd Jim and volunteers are taking Messy Church on the road, and running a lunchtime Messy Church club at St Paul's Church of England Primary School in Utkinton, looking at the theme of the Psalms: Songs for life. Looking at six Psalms with interested pupils, through crafts and games, these are then followed by whole school Collective Worship. Once again, Revd Jim's love of Lego seems to be coming to the fore!




St Helen's Day – Tarporley Primary school

Continuing the rural connection theme Walter Gibson reviews:-

'Village Hours' by Ronald Blythe

This a little gem of a book for all those who love the rhythms of life in the country and the church year. The author, who died recently at the age of 100, was steeped in knowledge and love of rural life, its history, buildings and people. He is best known for his book 'Akenfield' which became a classic. He was also a lay reader in the Church of England.

He weaves both these strands of his life together in this book, which is a series of reflections, month by month, on his world: the old farmhouse where he lives

in Suffolk, the land around it, his friends and memories, the seasonal rituals in the church and village life. It goes at a gentle pace and meanders like an old river. It is beautifully written, almost poetic.

He recalls the past vividly and observes changes happening in the present, but there is little apprehension about the future. Somehow there is reassurance from looking back that the cycles of life will go on and that beauty will still be there to be found in nature, traditions, and friendship. He finds joy in the small things that happen around him.

This is a book that can be read in different ways: you can dip in and out, or read a chunk at a stretch. Either way it is one to take time over, to travel at the author's pace and let yourself be entranced by the images and learning he displays. It was written in his late eighties so it draws together a lifetime of wisdom and knowledge to inspire and enlighten us. *Walter Gibson*
