**The Rector Writes:-**

By the time you read this, we will have a new government, many new MPs and most probably a new Prime Minister and a change of ruling political party. With the potential for big societal changes understandably comes a lot of worry and anxiety for many (how will this affect the life I've been used to in the last 14 years? What will it mean for my business, my children, my pension, my parents?), whilst also bringing new hope for others (a chance for a new start, an elevated position, the chance to finally be heard and supported, a fresh set of ideas and policies).



Later this month will also see the sad closure of one of our church schools, St Paul's in Utkinton. As the headteacher Natasha outlined in last month's *Link*, this decision was certainly not taken lightly, but also due to factors outside of the school's control. Having been part of the fabric of Utkinton and Cotebrook for nearly 170 years, its closure will bring an end to an important part of local life.

In both of these contexts, national and local, it is important to say goodbye well, to not rush onwards but take time to acknowledge the pain and loss; however, it is also important, despite the sadness, to see new opportunities not just endings. At the present we don't know what a new government will bring, or what will happen to the site of the school, but with both there will be opportunities.

Maria in *The Sound of Music* is consoled that 'When the Lord closes a door, somewhere he opens a window.'" However, anyone who has tried to get into a house through the window will know that this isn't as comforting a phrase as first sounds....

But maybe there is some truth in it? The ending of something can lead to a new opportunity, but there is no guarantee that this opportunity is a *straightforward* one; it might require some dexterity, new equipment, determination and help, but nevertheless it still offers a chance of something new. It might not be what we hoped for or planned, but that doesn't mean God is not involved.

At times of endings and beginnings it is natural to ask 'Where is God in this?' I am always reminded that God is bigger than the box that we make for him/her: two passages in Isaiah spring to mind: in Isaiah 55:8-9, God says '*For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways,*' says the Lord. *For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts;* and then in Isaiah 43:19, God proclaims: *Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.* The ending of a beloved school or a political party in power might signal the time to look for the window that has been opened, to see where and how God is moving in new ways.

God is a God of newness and surprise, of a different way of thinking and acting, seeing beyond our finite thoughts and understanding of each situation. I hope that in the midst of potentially turbulent times, both nationally and locally, we can have faith that the God of newness is still in charge, jemmying open a window or two....

## The Church at the Cheshire Show

Each year in mid-June the Church of England celebrates its close relationship with the agricultural community as the many skills and traditions associated with the countryside are demonstrated and celebrated at the Cheshire Show.

The show lasts for 2 days, this year it was Tuesday and Wednesday the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of June and the Chester Diocese of the Church of England have a large presence in the form of a marquee for church services and displays/exhibits from various church organisations. At the entrance to the church tent there is also a 'pop-up' church bellringing tower. Editor's note: a sincere thank you to the teams whose hard work on the church tent and belltower enabled the euphemism 'pop up' to be used!

A Service of blessing was held at the church marquee on the Monday evening prior to the public opening on Tuesday to bless the Show and all participants and visitors. During this service representatives of the various organisations involved bring forward gifts representing their particular skill or trade.

Further Church Services were held at 8.00am and 2.00pm on the Tuesday and Wednesday of each show day. The Church marquee and bell tower are open during the day for people to view the exhibits, have a chat, pray or perhaps even try their hand at bellringing!

## Tarporley War Memorial Hospital Trust update.

We are pleased to announce that the Tarporley War Memorial premises have become a rural hub for the provision of health and social care services in the community. Our strategic clinical partner, the Countess of Chester NHS Foundation Trust, has been welcoming and treating patients at the hospital and feedback is extremely positive.

The list of services provided continues to evolve and here is a reminder of the services now available:

Ultrasound, Physiotherapy, Children's therapy team, Neurotherapy team, Podiatry, doppler, leg ulcer and dressing clinics, Community midwives' and health visitor open advice clinics, Diabetes education group, AAA (abdominal aortic aneurysm) screening, Private counselling/therapy services, Autism and ADHD assessments, Pelvic floor clinics, Rapid Response and Hospital at Home.

All clinical services are provided by the Countess of Chester NHS Foundation Trust and access to the services is usually arranged by your GP practice or following a hospital referral.
