## WEST MIDLANDS TEAM VISIT 2022



A team of 8 people will visit Hands at Work Africa - Charity. Hands at work now operate in 8 African Countries but we will be visiting South Africa and Eswatini (Swaziland). Whilst there, we will be helping the Care Workers prepare the nutritious meal which allows them some free time so we can share with them and give them some encouragement. In the afternoon we are often allowed time for a visit to a home, to share with the primary care Giver which could be a Grandma or Widow. When the children return from school, we help serve the hot meal and play games with the children.

**Zwelisha Care Point** - Zwelisha supports 75 children daily. Nikiwi coordinates the 6 Care workers. Zwelisha is one of the poorest of the poor communities in South Africa. Many children do not have identification papers meaning that they are unable to finish school and in many cases are chased away by their teachers. Additionally, there is a lack of access to food and clean water.

**Mesengeni** Care Point Eswatini (Swaziland). All the care points in Eswatini operate in the poorest of the poor communities. Mesengeni supports 100 children daily, coordinated by Phindile and 13 other careworkers. The effects of many years of drought have caused a food crisis increasing the vulnerability. To ensure access to clean water Hands pays for a water truck to transport water into the community together with 3 water filters to ensure bacteria are filtered out ensuring clean water.
