

This Sunday we celebrate **Christ the King**.

The feast of Christ the King is recognised by many denominations including the Church of Scotland. It was first marked in 1925 By the Roman Catholic Church in a time of rising totalitarianism. Christ the King was intended to assert the power of Christ in the world, over the power of war and totalitarianism. The bringing of the world into the order of God transcends political vision and political authority. On this Sunday also we look forward to Advent and the expectations of 'God with us' at Christmas through our actions in the world. Christmas is about much more than a baby in a manger; Christ came to rule as the Prince of Peace.

For children there is a **crèche** and a **Sunday School** for children. Visiting children are feel free to join in, please ask those on the door for guidance. The minister leading worship this morning is **Rev. James Aitken**. **Shahrukh Gill**, a ministry student attached to St. Ninian's, will be preaching the sermon. THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

SCRIPTURE: John 18: 33 - 37

(New Revised Standard Version) ³³ Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, 'Are you the King of the Jews?' ³⁴ Jesus answered, 'Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?' ³⁵ Pilate replied, 'I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?' ³⁶ Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not from

this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here.' ³⁷ Pilate asked him, 'So you are a king?' Jesus answered, 'You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.'
