St Martin's Messenger Group



This Group meets after the 10am Parish Communion on the second Sunday of each month in the Coffee Corner, we finish at about 11.45am. It discusses questions left in the 'On Message' box at the back of the church. Anyone may attend and anyone submit questions either by name or anonymously. It doesn't matter how difficult the questions are, in fact the more difficult the better!

The Group's general thoughts and conclusions will be published monthly in the magazine.

The group opened with its first session on Sunday 21st July after the 10 am service.

We started with a question about a line from the hymn 'God is working His purpose out', words by *A. C. Ainger, 1841-1919* – *who incidently lived for a while in a house bordering Ealing Common, (Tune 'Benson' by Millicent Kingham 1866-1894)*. The 'mystery' line is: 'as the waters cover the sea.' – what does that mean?

This was explained as a possible reference to ancient pre-Copernican times when the world was seen as having a heaven above (where the waters are), our earth (with its sea) and hell below. 'As the waters cover the sea' would refer to the waters of heaven enfolding the sea on

earth as a kind of divine blessing. (See: *Genesis 1 vv 6-8 which states that on the second day of creation God 'divided the waters that were on the earth from the waters that He placed above the earth when He made a 'firmament' (Hebrew: rāqīya, meaning 'expanse') between those waters. See also: Habakkuk 2 v14 'For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea'. Also see: Isaiah 11 v 9 'They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea'.*

Another question discussed was why Jesus described himself as the *Son of Man* and not the Son of God? We noted that although others do of him (For example Matthew 27 v 54 where the centurion guarding Jesus on the cross says 'Truly this man was the Son of God!') Jesus never describes himself in this way. The term is used in all four gospels and 'Son of man' can be found in the prophetic Book of Ezekiel where it is used no less than 93 times! *Son of man* here appears to be a title referring to the humanity of the author. It also appears in the Book of Daniel see Chapter seven where the 'Son of man' figure takes on a more divine status.

Perhaps Jesus was referring to himself as the Son of Mankind, a kind of everyman son being reborn from generation to generation. However, although 'Son of Man' is a distinct from 'Son of God', some gospel passages do equate them, for example in the fourteenth chapter of the Gospel of Mark during the trial of Jesus when the high priest asks: "Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed one?" Jesus replies "I am: and you shall see the Son of man sitting at the right hand of Power, and coming with the clouds of heaven."

The discussion then broadened into a general interchange of ideas before closing just before midday. It is surprising how much we know collectively!

First results from the 2012 London Church Census

The number of people going to church on a Sunday in London leaped by 16% between 2005 and 2012. There are roughly 720,000 people in London going to church on a Sunday, nearly 100,000 more than the last time they were counted, seven years ago.

The diverse congregations filling London's churches on a Sunday now represent a quarter of all English churchgoers, as 8.8% of Londoners go to church each week (nearly 10% in inner London) compared with 5.6% of people in the rest of England.

These findings are from the London Church Census commissioned by London City Mission and carried out by Brierley Consultancy in October 2012.

The growth is largely driven by London's ethnic diversity. Two new churches opened in London every week between 2005 and 2012. Two-thirds of them were Pentecostal Black Majority Churches (BMC) and a third catered for a particular language or ethnic group. Another vibrant strand in London's church growth is the number of larger churches, categorised as those with over 200 people on a Sunday, though over a third of them have more than 500.

Larger churches account for 23% of all churches and just over half of all churchgoers (54%). The very largest congregations, the 140 that have over 800 people attending each Sunday, represent 3% of the churches and 12% of the churchgoers in London.

Sixty Years on how the C of E has changed during the Queen's reign

For the past 60 years the Queen has been 'head' of the Church of England. What changes have there been in our churches since June 1953? A lot has happened in the past 60 years.

For one thing, the population of the United Kingdom has grown, while church membership has shrunk. In 1953, church members were a fifth of the population (19%), but by 1973 had dropped to 15%, and by 1993 to 11%, and to an estimated 8% in 2013, a decline not quite so rapid as previously, probably again because many of the immigrants are Christian adherents (a 2000 survey indicated that 24% were Christian).

The number of churches has kept within the 50-55,000 range throughout the Queen's reign, declining from 1953 to 1993 but growing over the last 20 years, especially in England. For example, some 700 new churches have started in London alone between 2005 and 2012.

In 1953 there was an average of 180 members per church; in 1983 the average was 140 per church and in 2013 the average is 110 members per church.

There were 42,000 ministers in 1953, dropping to 36,000 by 1983 and staying at about that level until 2003, since when the number has grown to 37,000 in 2013.

While the total number of ministers has thus not changed greatly over the past 40 years, the proportion who are female has increased markedly, to nearly a fifth (19%) of the total in 2013, this percentage varying between zero in some denominations (like the Roman Catholics and Orthodox) to half or more in others (like the Methodists and Salvation Army).

Regardless though of varying statistics over the past 60 years, two facts remained unchanged – the privileged position of the Church of England as the bedrock church of this nation and the inspiring unchanging personal faith of our Sovereign Queen.

Financial Statistics for the C of E in 2011

Parish incomes continue to increase, passing £900 million for first time at £916 million, up £20 million on 2010, according to the latest parish finance statistics published by the Church of England.

Income from giving in 2011 increased by 1.3% to £546 million, with planned giving exceeding £10 per subscriber each week for the first time and tax-efficient giving reaching £10.70 a week. At £46.40 a month, this is more than double the average donation to the charitable sector of £17.00 a month.

Dr John Preston, National Stewardship Officer, said, "2011 saw another year of increased parish incomes and giving, in large part due to the faith and commitment of regular givers. Although overall growth in income was lower than inflation, it is encouraging to note that the average weekly gift from our planned givers rose by a further 3%."

Other figures showing improvement include income from parish investments, up 7% as markets improved, and income from trading, such as book stalls, parish magazines and church halls, up 6%.

Investment in church buildings, for maintenance and improvements to facilities for community use, topped £200 million for first time, in 2011. Parishes made significant donations to mission organisations and other charities, totalling £49 million in 2011.

Average weekly tax-efficient giving in dioceses ranged from £6.40 to £20.20; while weekly giving per electoral roll member ranged from £4.10 to £9.40.

What if the church saw blood and organ donation as part of its giving?

The Church of England has partnered with the NHS alongside other Christian groups to encourage everyone to think about the Christian mandate to heal and care for others. This campaign seeks to motivate more people to give blood and register as an organ donor.

It is said that 96% would take an organ if they needed one whereas 31% of people are registered organ donors. Also that 96% of us rely on 4% to give blood. 7,000 units of blood are needed every day to meet hospital demand with approximately 225,000 extra blood donors needed per year. Around 1,000 people die each year waiting for a transplant.
