

October

October is inevitably associated with autumn and at St Martin's we always celebrate our Harvest Festival on the first Sunday in October, in symphony with the poet Keats' sentiments in his 'Ode to Autumn'. John Keats wrote the poem in 1819 at a particularly difficult time in his life but it still conjures up beautiful sentiments encapsulated in the opening line, 'Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness'.

Harvest is important to us even in urban London where we live. It's a rare opportunity to reconnect somehow with our rural hinterland, to reflect on God's goodness and to think of others less privileged than ourselves. This latter is becoming particularly important as we wrestle as a nation and indeed as a continent of Europe with the growing number of migrants who have been displaced by the horrors in their homelands in the Middle East. I have no solution to offer but somehow displaced peoples need a compassionate response even whilst their very numbers seem overwhelming.

On a brighter note on Sunday 18th October at 10am we will not only celebrate the confirmation of candidates young and adult at our annual confirmation service but we will welcome the Rev'd Brandy and Rob Pearson into our Christian family here at St Martin's. It'll be a joyful occasion and remind us of our fellowship in Christ. This is an October and Harvest theme in the sense of fulfilment and completion as well a marking of new beginnings.

With this latter in mind may I take the opportunity to thank those of you who have been so generous in helping us over a particularly difficult financial period when we have had to undertaken significant refurbishment in St Martin's Cottage. Thank you also in advance for your generosity in supporting our Annual Gift Day.

Sometimes church life can seem to all about giving but that is actually in the spirit of our Faith and the teaching of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who quoted by St Paul in the Book of Acts 20 v 35 says: 'it is more blessed to give than receive'. At the heart of our Faith also is the Christ who gave his life for our sakes.

So October represents completion, harvest and fulfilment and could for the sake of argument represent what we all aspire to as taught by Jesus, namely 'the Kingdom of God'.

Harvest Festival 4 October 2015

Once again, we are asking for donations towards the work of our local women's refuge.

At any one time, the refuge houses twelve women and their children who are fleeing from domestic violence to a place of safety. They usually stay there for about 6 months, and in this time have an opportunity to regain their self-respect and make practical plans for their future.

For some years we have been actively involved in supporting the refuge, and have developed strong ties. Through the year we have been making up Welcome Packs, and so far 20 new residents have each received one of these.

At the Harvest Festival, we welcome donations of food, fruit and vegetables. You can bring store-cupboard items such as tinned fish or meat, longlife milk, tea, pasta, etc. They can also use fresh vegetables as they have cooking facilities. Fresh fruit is particularly welcome.

We are also asking for items for inclusion in the welcome packs (many of these things can be purchased in the local pound-shops). Here is the list:

Body wash or shower gel
Shampoo, both for women and children
Tooth brushes for adults and children
Toothpaste for adults and children
Towels
Deodorant (roll-on)
Body and hand lotion
Nappies
Tissues
Sanitary towels
Knickers for women and children
Baby wipes
Notebooks (A5 size)





Edward the Confessor Helping to found Westminster Abbey

If you approve of giving money to help cathedrals survive, then Edward the Confessor (1003–66) is the saint for you. This early King of England was the virtual founder of Westminster Abbey. And never mind entrance charges – at one point in his life, Edward was giving a full tenth of his income to Westminster Abbey.

Edward was the son of King Ethelred the Unready and his second, Norman wife, Emma. After various ups and downs which included a brief exile in Normandy, Edward was made king of England in 1042.

As King, Edward had a tricky time of it – trying to keep the peace for over 20 years while various Danish and Norman magnates struggled for power (which eventually led to the Norman Conquest). Scholars have argued over how much of a success he was as a king.

As a Christian, there is no doubt: Edward's holiness was evident to all. He made himself accessible to his people. He was generous to the poor, and chaste. He was also reputed to have seen visions and even achieved miraculous cures for people through prayer.

Edward did much to help the Church in many ways. His lasting contribution was the original Westminster Abbey – a huge Romanesque church, 300 feet long, with a nave of 12 bays. Westminster Abbey became the place of coronation and burial of kings and queens of England. It was finished and consecrated just before his death. Edward was buried there, and his relics are undisturbed to this day.

During the Middle Ages, Edward was a very popular saint: along with Edmund of East Anglia he was widely considered to be England's patron saint for a time.

October 13th is the day set to remember him.

Psalms on the go - CofE launches new mobile app

The latest publication from the Church of England brings an ancient tradition of following the Psalms to mobile devices and e-readers. *Reflections on the Psalms* is a standalone book, ebook and mobile app written for anyone wishing to follow the ancient practise of the Psalter, reading the Psalms of the Bible each morning and evening.

The mobile app is available to buy on the iOS App Store, with an Android version coming soon. Users are asked to tweet their favourite #mypsalm @chpublishingUK.

The new publication provides short meditations on each of the Psalms written by Bishops, well-known writers, experienced ministers, biblical scholars and theologians. The Archbishop of York, Dr John Sentamu, a contributor, said: "Reading and listening to the Psalms is a great way to start a conversation with God. I love reading and reflecting on them daily."

Plastic carrier bags

How many plastic carrier bags do you have stashed away? The average is 40 for each household in the UK. But the amount of new bags that we use each month is likely to drop drastically from this month onwards. Last year in England shoppers used 11.7 free bags each month. In Wales, where a 5p charge for each bag was introduced, just two were used each month. This month throughout England a 5p charge will be introduced.

************ 100 years ago this month

Edith Cavell was a British Nurse and living in Belgium. When War was declared and chose to remain working as a Nurse. She saved the lives of injured soldiers regardless of which side they were on. Edith Cavell was executed on 12th October 1915 for helping British soldiers escape from German-occupied Belgium. There is a statue in her memory opposite the National Portrait Gallery, near St Martin's-in-the Fields.
