

Nations'World Meteorological
Organisation figures show that this
last year global temperature was
1.2C above pre-industrial levels
and set a new high for the third

year running, I am afraid that the chances are decreasing of me ever using the four toboggans that are in the vicarage garden shed.

These are indeed strange times, not only weather-wise but politically and socially. Somehow the world seems tipped upside down and out of sorts. As Don McLean's old song used to go there is so often 'bad news on the doorstep'. Perhaps I am getting old because I ought to know that bad news is news and good news always seems less interesting from the media's point of view? Nevertheless, we are almost hardened to a constant litany of suffering from bullet and bomb, natural disaster and 'man's inhumanity to man'.

Which almost perversely, brings us to the brave new world of 2017 that awaits us? This coming Lent we are tackling some of the hard questions that we might expect to come up over the year, they include questions of conflict, politics, genetics, welfare, and sex. A heady mix but Christians must never let themselves become detached from reality we are called to be citizens of this world as well as subjects of the next.

What better then as a spiritual exercise might there be than to see God as an innocent child born in humble circumstances and destined to die for our sakes. This is a revolutionary concept, one that has the power to remind us that God loves the simple, the rejected, the suffering and even us. Perhaps when we are feeling depressed about the world around us we can remember this. We have just celebrated the concept at Christmas now we need to live it.

Thank God, people are still inclined to come to church, to slow their normal secular lifestyle and seek something beyond them. In this the

Church must be what it always should be, welcoming to the stranger, non – judgmental and open to change. Sadly and too often the Church gives out a negative message with protests and prohibitions about things that are nothing more than moral relativities. Instead we should live the glorious Gospel of freedom and redemption.

I like to think that St Martin's is quite good at welcoming people whoever they are? Certainly people do report that we are a friendly congregation and in this respect we might consider it as a bonus? It is a truism to say that people come back to a church, not because of the fine liturgy, or even because of a good sermon but because they have received a warm and convivial welcome.

So 'will it snow'? Perhaps or perhaps not, the future is unknown but our resolve as followers of Christ shouldn't be.

The Church started its New Year last Advent Sunday but may I also wish you a very happy 2017.



The Women's Refuge

The residents and staff of the refuge have asked me to thank all the people who have recently made donations.

They were very pleased with the produce which was given at the Harvest Festival. Each of the current residents received some of the fresh food and the staff have reserved the unperishable food which they give out to new residents who often arrive with no money to purchase food.

As most of you know, we prepare "Welcome Packs" for new residents. These consist of a laundry basket filled with new towels, toiletries, toothbrushes, new underwear, tissues etc; the necessities which are needed for basic hygiene but are often overlooked when women are in a hurry to flee from domestic violence. So far this year we have supplied 30 baskets to new residents. Our baskets are always well received; the women and the staff are grateful for our practical concern.

Over the last few months members of the congregation and their friends have also kindly donated lovely clothes for children and babies as well as other baby goods. At present there are a lot of young children and toddlers staying in the refuge with their mothers, and indeed they have recently had 2 new babies. These children all grow very fast and the women have been delighted with all your gifts.



They have asked me to thank you all for the support which they receive from our church. It means a lot to them that we are taking the trouble to care for women and children who find themselves in such a desperate situation that have had to leave their homes.
