

### **Note from Bryony**

By the time you are reading this, we will have had the third set of interviews for our next vicar. Hopefully we will also have found the right person for St Martin's! Either way, we will have been without a vicar for around 18 months, which may feel like a very long time. We are incredibly fortunate in having Brandy and Rob, who've been very generous in doing far more than they might have been expected to do, and our church wardens and the rest of the Parochial Church Council have been doing a fantastic job in keeping everything going. But I'm sure we are all looking forwards to having a new vicar to provide leadership and vision, and to take us forwards in putting our faith into action in our parish.

It may be easy (and natural) to find it disappointing or frustrating that we are having to wait to find the right person, or to wonder where God's hand is in this. This leads me to reflect on what the Bible says about waiting. The themes of waiting and patience are woven throughout many books of the Bible, with numerous examples of those who had to wait – Abraham, Job, Noah, the Israelites... and the importance of patience is highlighted in Proverbs, the Psalms and in the Prophets. For example, Isaiah promises that those "who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint" (Isaiah 40:31; NRSV). So waiting is not always a passive activity in which nothing is happening. Perhaps we needed to wait a while, to continue to grow as a church community and to develop a better idea of what we want to be, what we want to change, and what we want to stay the same.

By the time this newsletter is in the church porch, I pray that we will have found the right person to be our vicar. But regardless of the outcome, let's remain confident in God's hand being upon us, thankful for Brandy and Rob, and optimistic for what the future will bring.



Professor Bryony Dean Franklin, a member of our congregation since 2006, was ordained as a Deacon on Saturday 29th June by the Rt Hon & Rt Revd Dame Sarah Mullally, Bishop of London. Many members of St Martin's attended the service, which was held at St Paul's Cathedral. Bryony has now joined the clergy team at St Martin's as Assistant Curate, and will be serving a day a week plus most Sundays, alongside continuing to work four days a week in her NHS and academic roles. Deacons wear the stole diagonally across the body, with this symbolism based on the towel that Jesus washed his disciples' feet with at the Last Supper, as a reminder of the Deacon's vows of loving service.
