#### Change

Change is something we all react to differently. Some of us are very change-averse, really disliking the everyday changes that happen in our lives. Others are more accepting, looking for the positives in new things. Most of us are firmly in the middle! I have never quite seen the truth of the old saying that change is as good as a rest, though.

All of us find change challenging at times; clearly it depends what the changes are. There are a great many "for" and "against" quotes about change – one of the most favoured is "if it ain't broke, don't fix it". I like the one by Eckhart Tolle, the spiritual writer, who said: "Some changes look negative on the surface, but you will soon realize that space is being created in your life for something new to emerge."

David Attenborough has a more down-to-earth perspective: "the snake that does not shed its skin will die". The basis of a good and vibrant church is, of course, that the good news, or Gospel, is at the heart of everything. In order to have that sort of church in this changing world we need to appeal to all ages, and keep up with the current thinking, choosing the best of it to develop to suit ourselves. Just staying the same is not an option, because if change is not allowed, a church will not grow. In my experience locally I have seen this happen – churches have been so reduced in size that they have been closed or combined.



Here at St Martin's we have had a big change. Nick Henderson had been our vicar for a very long time. When he retired, we were very lucky that Brandy and Rob were available and willing to help us through what might have been a very difficult interregnum. Friends have told me about their experiences and I think we got off very lightly.

Now we have Julia, we can look with more confidence to the future of St Martin's. She has had good experience, and can help us look again at some of our approach to the great festivals of the church relatively painlessly. She is just getting her feet under the table; we have had her first Christmas, and now we are rapidly approaching Easter.

I was really surprised to find that we have had our red Common Worship booklets for more than 15 years, although from the look of some of them they have certainly seen some hard service. I think that the new "seasonal" booklets that Julia is trialing are a welcome new look at our main service – and to avoid waste we need to remind ourselves not to treat them as souvenirs and take them home with us! Brandy's artistic and layout skills have made the new ones look very attractive.

The Great Annual Egg Rolling competition is coming – gentlemen, maybe this will be your lucky year! – or maybe not!

#### 1st March: St David's Day

St David is well-known as the patron saint of Wales. To mark his day, Welsh people around the world often wear one or both of their national emblems – a daffodil and a leek.

Every year, a National St David's Day parade is held in the centre of Cardiff, with many children wearing traditional Welsh clothing and performances from dragons and theatre groups.

St David was born on the south-west coast of Wales at some point between 462 and 515AD, near to where the city of St Davids is today. It was said that he lived for more than 100 years and died on Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> March 589.

It is believed that his last words to his followers before his death were: "Be joyful, keep the faith and do the little things that you have heard and seen me do."
