

Looking forward with hope

There's no doubt about it – the past six months have been like no other in living memory, with the total lockdown of communities, normal routines gone, and people dying from a virus which has no vaccine. It's the sort of thing we find in a science fiction film – but now it's real life. For some, not being able to see loved ones or attend a funeral would be unthinkable a few months ago. But that has been the harsh reality.

As a church we share a Gospel of hope. We hold the light in the darkness and in the midst of suffering we know that Christ stands with us. St John of the Cross writes: "In the dark night of the soul, bright flows the river of God." So, what is the light in the darkness? What are the blessings in all of this? You may have your own, but I've come up with three: the importance of relationships and connecting as the body of Christ; the gift of technology and how it has connected people together and spread the Gospel; the blessing of a prayer routine which has helped to anchor me in the maelstrom of this present time.

But more than this is the hope we find in the Gospel. September gives us reason to hope. We now have the church open for services. They may be a bit different, but we are there, worshipping and connecting as the Body of Christ. We have the priesting of Rev. Bryony Franklin, which should have happened in July, but is now on 25th September. We are blessed and grateful for Bryony's ministry. We are also grateful for the ministry of Revs. Rob and Brandy Pearson, who will be retiring on the 6th September. We hope for health and happiness for their future. In September we also see a stark change in the seasons as autumn approaches. The harvest is brought in, the nights become darker, temperatures drop and the leaves swirl in the autumn winds. We are reminded that change is inevitable, and nothing is permanent, although we do know there will be more summers to come.

So in all the chaos of the pandemic let us remember that "This too shall pass", first used by Abraham Lincoln as a mantra to help him through difficult times. But do not forget to notice and count your blessings too.

Dates for the diary

Organic September: A month-long campaign to raise awareness and consumption of organic products, while also supporting the farmers, producers and brands who make them possible.

While great progress has been made, 773 million adults and young people lack basic literacy skills. Literacy is also an integral element of eradicating poverty and inequality.

15th September: International Day of Democracy. It's important to spread the values of freedom, human rights and genuine elections worldwide – now more than ever.
