Rev. Calvin Samuel's Pastoral Letter

In years to come when we reflect on 2023 the conflict in Israel–Palestine will loom large in our memory. The senseless taking of life and destruction of communities will leave a legacy that will continue to scar the region for a generation.



And that it is occurring in the land in which the stories of the Christmas took place makes it all the more poignant at this time of year.

However, it's always worth reminding ourselves that the birth of Jesus, so often depicted in beautiful nativity scenes, actually occurred in a time of great turmoil, political unrest and enormous change.

Christmas is a reminder of Immanuel, God with us, not in some idealized version of life, but in the everyday, realistic, messy, chaotic, and broken lives that we lead now. God came among us as a vulnerable child, born in poverty to teenage parents. Here in our messiness and uncertainty we are called to live out our Christian discipleship marked by faith, hope and love.

Presumably because the pandemic has affected the way we remember the passage of time, it hardly seems credible that I'm in my fourth year of ministry here in Hockley and Hawkwell and my fifth in the circuit.

This means that this will be is my fourth and final Christmas as Methodist minister for Hockley & Hawkwell. My appointment in the Southend & Leigh Circuit is due to come to an end by August 2024.

During sabbatical I took some time to think and pray about what my next move should be. I have been given permission by our church to seek an appointment overseas. So, I am seeking a role in Malaysia as my next appointment from September 2024. As we look to 2024 and all that the next year will bring, I'm conscious that clergy transition often feels like a time of

uncertainty. The reality, of course, is that God is always in control. So, whilst we don't know what the future holds, we do know the one who holds the future.

All God's blessings for Christmas and the New Year.



A message from HARP

Hello and season's greetings to you all,

I wanted to pass on my sincere thanks on behalf of HARP this year particularly over Harvest where we collected thousands of items to feed people living in our in our services. This included over 1000 tins of baked beans and 1500 cans of soup. This amazing support means we saved significantly on our 'food shop' and allows us to direct funds raised into providing the vital support that people need to overcome homelessness for good.

As we approach the cold months ahead we wanted to let you know that HARP is opening a winter shelter for people who are currently rough sleeping.

The shelter will be managed by HARP staff and volunteers and will open from 7pm every evening and close at 8.30am with people using the shelter then being encouraged to visit HARP's Bradbury Centre during the day for breakfasts, hot showers and to access other services as normal. We are working in partnership with the council on this initiative.

How can you get involved?

 We are in need of a range of items including gifts to give visitors over Christmas, but critically we need pillows, duvets, single sheets and winter clothes.
