

## "SUMMER-TIME" The Trinity Season

We now find ourselves in the season of 'Sundays After Trinity', that long period (of 20+ weeks) where there are few festivals and other focal points. It stretches from the climax of Pentecost, through to the beginnings of Advent, and provides the Church's calendar with a period of reflection. Having celebrated the life of Christ, we – as the followers touched by that life – now have time to learn more, to soak up the richness of scripture, worship and prayer, so that we become more 'grounded' in our faith, and eager to continue in our witness.

During this "Summer-Time", the principal scripture for this year will centre around the Gospel of Matthew. In the attached liturgy, we have given you the climax to that work, the closing words that are known as the 'Great Commission', guiding and encouraging the disciples (which includes us!) to go out into the world, spread the word through witness, and be ambassadors of God. You may like to use Matthew's writings throughout by choosing to read the whole gospel during this time of 'closure' of our Church, taking a short extract each week.
