

Letter from the Rector

Dear friends,

Isn't it always surprising how time seems to fly? It feels like yesterday that we joyfully celebrated the birth of our saviour, and now we are already busy preparing for Lent with a view to Easter! Not that this is a bad thing, because I am really looking forward to Lent! While Lent can sound like a season of

painful self-constraint and flagellation, I very much hope you have come to experience it, like me, as an exciting and empowering time when we are invited by God to make choices that enable us to live 'life to the fullest' - life in a closest possible relationship with God and our neighbour. Lent is a season in which we can choose to make a conscious effort to spend more time with God and our neighbour, and choose to turn off, or at least dial down, some of the distractions we usually face. This year, together with the whole Church of England, we will be focussing on God the Creator and on our own relationship with, and responsibility for, God's creation. Our relationship with our natural environment has become a pressing issue for many people and politics, and I think it is therefore a topic where we stand on common ground with people from outside the church, or of other faiths. I therefore hope we can discuss these enormously pressing questions, together with many who otherwise would not come to our church, and together find ways in which we can fulfil our responsibilities towards God's creation, our neighbours and future generations better. Please ask your neighbours, colleagues and friends to join us! As in previous years, our Lent course will start with worship and an introduction to the Lent book on Ash Wednesday, and run until Maundy Thursday, with discussions over supper on the Wednesday evenings of the 4th, 18th and 25th of March, and 1st April. There will also be a morning version of the same course on 5 consecutive Tuesday mornings from 10.30 until 11.15, starting on 25 February, (with the option of coming for a chat with our Meeting Point mums and carers first, from 9.45am onwards). Both courses will be reading and discussing the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent suggestion book, 'Saying Yes to Life' by Ruth Valerio.

You probably have seen or heard that our beautiful church was broken into during the early hours of Christmas Eve. While nothing, or very little, has been stolen, the incident shows how selfish actions, while generating little or no gain for ones self, can have tremendous effects on other people, and wider society. We are in the process of gathering quotes for the various repair works, and while the greatest burden of these very costly repairs will hopefully fall on our insurance coverage, our church family will still have to face the excess, and increased premiums for the future. Much worse however, is the fact that our church building, and thus the worship that happens here, is no longer as accessible as it should be. If you are struggling with the deep steps leading up to the West-doors we currently have to use, please come in through the church centre, and this is especially vital if you are using a wheelchair. Some wheelchairs are too wide even to fit through the corridors that link the church centre with the church; so if you are wheelchair bound and wish to worship at St Mary's Shaw, please call ahead so that we can assist and accommodate you! I really hope that this very thoughtless incident will not stop anyone from coming to enjoy the many exciting activities and services at St Mary's Shaw that are waiting for us, among them a variety of wonderful concerts and a special Fairtrade Café Church service with a delicious Fairtrade breakfast in the pews on Sunday 23 February at 10am!



Think it can't be recycled? Think Teracycle


Ever wondered how you can recycle highlighter pens, marker pens,

chocolate bar wrappers, biscuit wrappers, toothpaste tubes, toothbrushes, bread packaging and lots of other things? Teracycle is a company partnering with individuals, manufacturers, retailers, small businesses, major consumer product companies and municipalities across over 20 countries to divert rubbish from landfill and recycle things previously thought un-recyclable. They will collect and recycle almost any form of waste. In Newbury there is someone collecting waste for Teracycle and we hope to provide somewhere at Church where you will be able to bring anything on the list below and I will deliver it – or you can deliver it yourself to 2 White Lodge Cottage, Bath Road, Speen. (It is down a side turning just before the Shell garage – see the map). There is a large green wheelie bin with the Teracycle sticker on it. The following items can all be re-cycled.

Chocolate and sweet pouches and bags, multipack outer plastic packaging, individual chocolate bar wrappers, Pringle tubes (including lids), Savoury and sweet biscuit/cracker wrappers, Toothpaste tubes & caps, toothbrushes, toothbrush packaging, Bread packaging (LDPE plastic only, which is the normal bread wrappers), Crisp packets, Aqua optima water filters, Pens, Highlighters, Correction pots, Marker pens, Foil (clean), Toner cartridges.

Lent Reflection

Lent is a time to notice God's work and to receive God's mercy.

The scriptures during this time, challenge us to also consider how we can repair our relationship with God and with others. Developing activities around memory and remembrance enables us to reflect on the love that Jesus has for us. Restoring our relationship with God and with others requires us to return to prayer.

Lent is a time to REPAIR:

Inward challenge: It might be relationships that we have neglected, or promises that we have broken, and saying sorry is a start to repairing the hurt.

Outward challenge: To raise the concerns of those in the world who are disadvantaged, and support them through our charitable giving.

Lent is a time to **REMEMBER**:

Inward challenge: By remembering the times we have been shown mercy and love, compassion and understanding; Outward challenge: Lent is the time to remember the many people, who in a thousand quiet ways, have stretched out their hands and given us hope to make a new beginning.

Lent is a time to RESTORE:

Inward challenge: Building regular prayer space in our the day to listen and speak to God.

Outward challenge: Creating opportunities for us to spend time praying for others.

Faith's fight for a green future

This Lent, let's pause and reflect on how climate change is affecting our sisters and brothers around the world. Right now, people like Faith are experiencing the worst drought in decades. In her parched fields in Kenya next to nothing grew.



Kenya faces severe droughts, which are getting more

frequent and more intense due to climate change. Without a reliable source of water, many communities are struggling to survive.

'We were facing a lot of trouble fetching water,' Faith said. 'We did not even try to do farming or plant vegetables because there was no water. We used to dig deep in the stream to get water. It took a lot of time because there were many other people trying to get water too.'

'The weather has changed because when I was young, there was a lot of rain and food was plenty. Today the rains are very poor. There was also a lot of livestock and today there are very few.'

Faith didn't have enough to eat or sell. Then Christian Aid's partner Anglican Development Services – Eastern (ADSE) helped her community build a sand dam.

The dam gives Faith's community resilience in times of drought – they can collect every last drop of water. 'The sand dam has helped us because we are getting water, as are many families in the village. Everyone is growing vegetables.'

Drought is still a threat; but now Faith has the tools she needs to adapt. With the dam, her fields stay green and her family has a hopeful future.

During Lent and Easter Christian Aid is encouraging people to do three things.

Firstly, to give donations that could help provide practical solutions for communities adapting to the worst of the climate crisis – could you hold a Lent lunch or church collection? Raising £100 could teach 22 farmers how to plant drought-resistant crops and provide them with appropriate seeds.

Secondly, to act by signing up to the New Deal for Climate Justice and helping to raise awareness. (www.christianaid.org.uk/campaigns/climate-change/climate-justice-petition)

Thirdly, to pray for those fighting against the worst effects of climate change and take meaningful actions in solidarity with them – order Count Your Blessings for you and your



church to put your faith into action through daily reflections and challenges at caid.org.uk/lent or follow online




