#### Dear Friends

As I write this some of the big stores are in the process of releasing their Christmas TV adverts. In recent years, competition has increased over who can produce the most popular Christmas advert. Rumour has it that for 2018 one major store has pulled out all the stops and called on the services of Elton John. By the time you read this we will know whether those rumours are correct!

However there is one advert this year that has been banned from TV. Given that it has since gone viral on social media, you will probably all know that I'm referring to the Iceland advert "Orangutan in my bedroom". That advert was made in consultation with the environmental group Greenpeace and it raises awareness over the problems of deforestation caused by the harvesting of palm oil. The result however was deemed too political for showing on television.

Yet, the Christmas story, around which all this commercialisation has grown up, is itself full of political implications. A saviour, long awaited by a people sorely oppressed, is born into poverty, in a country under occupation. The people who are first to welcome this child are shepherds who were at the time considered outcasts from society. They would be joined in due course by some wealthy foreigners from the east with unusual ideas. Not long after Jesus birth, his parents, Mary and Joseph, are forced to flee to protect the life of their child. They become refugees, asylum seekers in Egypt. Later throughout his life and ministry Jesus will show a particular concern for the weak and the vulnerable, the outcast and the stranger. And he will challenge his followers to do likewise.

There is no doubt that the Christian gospel is political. But somehow we have taken this story with its radical roots and submerged it in tinsel and glitter and Christmas adverts! Yet despite all our attempts, the good news of Christmas remains. In the birth of Jesus, God breaks into the world in a new way and touches our hearts with the radical love that is the gift of Emmanuel, God with us. It is my hope and prayer that this Christmas we will all experience that love and celebrate Christ's coming into the world as a baby at Bethlehem, together.

And so let me finish with a Christmas Advert for the Church! Details of our Advent and Christmas services and activities are shown elsewhere in this magazine.

There are some new things happening as well as the old favourites. You and your family can be sure of a welcome at any or all of these. Come

The lunch afterwards was a great success, providing a welcome opportunity for a social gathering.

## Soup 'n Sweet for Harvest

Saturday 20 October saw us hold a very enjoyable and well attended soup and sweet lunch as an alternative to our usual Sunday evening stovies. A big thank you to all those who made this such a great community event. There was quite a buzz and £1020 was raised for church funds.

#### **Harvest Festival Service**

Sunday 21 October: This thought provoking service was well attended with a variety of participants.

#### Alistair Murdoch

Alistair, who was ordained as an elder on 20 November 1983, died on 20 October. Latterly ill-health prevented him from being active but he had served for many years in Tarves, particularly in property matters. It is with sadness that we acknowledge his long commitment to the Kirk.

#### **Autumn Communion**

Sunday 28 October saw a departure from our usual as Communion was served using the ancient method of tincture, partly dipping the bread into the wine before taking it. Thus we all took the elements in exactly the same way from the goblets that were first used in Tarves Church 400 years ago. This made for a special experience.

#### Service of Remembrance

This year Remembrance Sunday fell on the 11 November and was a commemoration of the end of World War 1. The Church bell rang out on both Saturday and Sunday evenings and it was rung eleven times at the eleventh hour on the eleventh day. The Church was full as people came to acknowledge this important occasion. We welcomed many Rainbows and Brownies along with those who had served in the armed forces. It was moving to hear once again the roll call of names from the Tarves War Memorial and to learn about local women who served. A large number of knitted poppies decorated the Church, with animals being represented by purple ones. There were poignant reminders throughout of the need to remember as well as our responsibility to build a world of peace. After the Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial the Colour Party and others visited the war graves in the Church cemetery. Then many folk enjoyed a hot drink and fellowship in the church.

To all our widespread knitting and sewing friends – thank you once again for your recent donations to our very active Community Corner in Tarves Church. 5 very well packed banana boxes of baby hats/scarves/vests/blankets/skirts and cuddly teddies went to Alford in October, then on to the BananaBox Trust warehouse in Dundee. This brings Tarves' donations to 21 boxes of baby knitting in 2018. Once 1,200 banana boxes have been collected in the Dundee warehouse, their overseas journey begins at Grangemouth docks via 3 different shipping ports then 3 lorry journeys, eventually ending at Nkhoma. Each banana box costs £10 to transport to Malawi and thanks to those who have already donated to this: there is a collection envelope in the Church Community Corner if you too, would like to contribute to this appeal.



We've also had a busy shopping morning with local stall holders coming to Hanover. We plan to held this again part year.







fantastic time exploring the museum and lighthouse and enjoying lots of lighthouse and nautical themed activities. A great time was had by all


Representatives from Tarves Brownies took part in the very significant Remembrance Service at Tarves

Although the Centre has now closed for winter, there's plenty to mention in this round-up of the season.

Our visitor numbers have been excellent, with many from far-flung places overseas and at home, with some of whom we've been able to help in tracing relatives and events from the past. In turn, some of those visitors have been able to help us, by putting names and places to photographs in our extensive archive – very satisfying on both sides.

Many will have seen and enjoyed the Tarves Parish Tapestry. It was the splendid result of much work from a dedicated team of folk from Tarves and Barthol Chapel, eventually making up three large panels. It has been 'walkabout' from time to time, being enjoyed in Hanover Court, in hospital wards, and in both Primary Schools. It is our hope that it will continue in exhibition from time to time, so keep an eye open for it if you've yet to experience it. The Tapestry will be on view again next season in the centre.

Visitors to the centre have enjoyed the displays and activities in both the Museum and Schoolroom, especially old toys, dressing up, and as always, trying out writing exercises with steel pens and 'real' ink – memories of those dreaded school ink exercises, with no room for errors! School visits are as popular as ever, and the Schoolroom experience quite lifelike, according to the many thank you notes we receive from our visitors. On occasion, maybe too lifelike, given the tears of one youngster who found the Victorian regime a little too much.....

Tarves Primary3/4 and their teacher, Mrs Hendry, worked with us to produce an in-depth study of 'Our Village' and at its completion made a Tarves Timeline which was displayed in the Schoolroom to much interest from visitors.

Some may have noticed a splendid new sign on the railings during opening hours – which, incidentally have been extended to cope with demand – along with some other improvements, the sign is, we hope, improving our visibility to passers-by. It seems to be working!

Another 'outside' improvement, in preparation for next season, is a new bench to enjoy on sunny days. It has been made possible by a generous donation from a Mrs Kirkpatrick from Sutton Coldfield, originally Tarves, the daughter of one Willie Mort, a clerk at the Bank many years ago.

We have repurposed two gable capstones from Craigdam Kirk, set aside when the Kirk was demolished many years ago, and sourced a length of hardwood to create the bench which will bring new use to part of our local heritage.



## TARVES DEVELOPMENT TRUST TO BUY THE MURLY TUCK

Tarves Development Trust has been awarded the funds to buy the Tarves Community Hub incorporating the Murly Tuck cafe, by the Scottish Land Fund. This will secure the Hub in community ownership in perpetuity

Following the closure of the former doctors' surgery in 2015, the building was put up for sale by Haddo Medical Group. In a surprise move, it was bought by a local resident, who wanted to help the community to acquire the property and keep it economically and socially active within the centre of the village. The Tarves Development Trust•(TDT) was set up to take forward the project, raising the funds to convert the building into the Community Hub.

Local couple Gill and Alfie Gray opened the Murly Tuck cafe for business in April 2017, which has been very well received with a 4.5/5 rating on TripAdvisor.

The Trust applied to the Scottish Land Fund for the cash to buy the building for the community in the summer of 2018 and heard that our application had been successful in November.

Income generated from the Hub will be reinvested into the community to develop activities and facilities, including ones that will provide further volunteer and employment opportunities. The TDT and Community Council have been asking the community what the local priorities are through the development of the Tarves Community Action Plan (CAP). Thank you to all who came to the CAP meeting and TDT AGM on 18th September at the Arms. And a big thank you to Val and Colin at the Arms for hosting the meetings and providing the refreshments.

#### The Ellon and District Men's Shed

Many men are still coming to the Ellon Men's Shed and enjoying meeting other men, playing games, as well as doing their hobbies and joining in with the Shed projects. Some of their wives have expressed how good it is for their husbands, not to mention that it gets them out of the house from under their feet! Throughout the winter the Shed will continue to be open on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10am to 4 pm. There is also a music group meeting on a Tuesday evening and the wood turners meet on a Thursday evening. Thursday afternoon in the Shed is for the model railway enthusiasts to meet and the railway development over this last period is spectacular. The Shed music group entertained the members on Tuesday 27th November. We do expect to be closed for two weeks over Christmas and Hogmanay and are having our Shed festive dinner in January at the Ellon Golf Club. I would like to thank all those that have worked on our projects, donated to our Shed or just visited for a cuppa and given us the benefit of their experience. It has been another period of great generosity from funders and local people donating tools, equipment, top soil and building materials.

The Co-op funding for our garden project came to an end in October with the third and final payment being received, totalling £2,200. Thank you to those who voted for our Shed at the Esslemont Co-op. Terrific progress has been made in the garden with eight 1.2 metre by 1 metre raised bed boxes being installed, wood treated and boxes lined and filled with soil. Pitmedden Recyclability provided the pallet collars from which the boxes have been constructed and our Shed made a suitable donation to them for this provision. Two greenhouse bases have been installed using paying slabs donated by Derek Davidson.

Dinky Diggers in Ellon provided a mini digger free of charge for the ground work and top soil was donated by James Jamieson Construction. One of our two donated aluminium 6 x 8 greenhouses has been mounted on to its base and the second greenhouse will soon follow. The Esslemont Co-op had a funding celebration day on 24<sup>th</sup> November where we displayed our garden pictures and thanked customers for voting for us. There is still allot to do in the garden to get the garden ready for next spring, so if you are interested in being involved, or just want to see what we are doing, come along.

To give us more social area space a 32ft by 10ft caravan has been located in our Shed outside area and the internals are being altered by the men to suit their needs. The caravan was free to pick up from Monlettie Farm and was transported to our Shed by Savoch Hire at a reasonable cost.

Flooring our Shed loft is going well after some electrical and plumbing work was completed to allow the floor boards to be fitted more easily. This will give us much more useable storage and project activity space for members to use. This is being financed by Bank of Scotland.

The shoebox appeal for Blytheswood was again well supported and the boxes were collected at the beginning of November.





# The Big Project - Barthol Chapel Kirk

It has been some time since the open meeting in Barthol Chapel church to discuss the possibility and feasibility of re-modelling the interior of the church to create a flexible space, which could be of greater use to the school, the community and others, as well as a place of worship. But we have not been idle and the idea progresses.

There is much to do at this early stage as the steering group consults and explores need, costs, feasibility, manageable stages, who might use the building, how it might generate income, sources of funding and all the many practical considerations that are part of a project of this size.

Since the open meeting at the end of April,

- The Kirk Session has agreed that it will find funding to carry out the necessary repairs to the roof and walls to make the building wind and watertight. It is hoped this repair work will be done in early 2019, only if and when the Church can secure the necessary funding.
- Once repaired, the building will be wind and watertight and the church and community can continue work together to explore the possibilities of the bigger project, within a sound building.
- The hope is to create a warm, flexible, accessible multi-use space for the whole community.
- Phil Booth of Covell Matthews Architects has kindly drawn up some inspiring sketch proposals to show how the building might be used in various configurations once the floor is levelled and the large space created. You can see these initial ideas in the church, at the café and on the website https://www.bartholchapel.com
- The steering group is looking at the Church/ community partnership to ensure sustainability and to safeguard the long-term position of the community, church and the building.
- It is also exploring funding opportunities. We have had one very small success
  with lottery funding, in that we have passed an initial stage and been invited to
  submit a full application, but there is no guarantee that the application will succeed.

It is very early days yet and it is very much one small step at a time, with reality checks at every stage along the way. But we will keep you informed of progress with a newsletter blog and through social media. Full details will be on the website shortly.

We would very much welcome feedback on the sketch proposals and all aspects of the project. 


