Editor's Letter

Hello readers - welcome to the September 2020 Tarves and Barthol Chapel Newsletter.

Two Tarves groups won Aberdeenshire Voluntary Action awards in August; one for the Tarves Grass Cutters, whose work allowed children and families back to the local parks for fresh air, sociable (where possible), energy burning playtime; the other award was for Care in Tarves Community.

Care in Tarves Community was initiated by our Parish Minister, Alison Swindells who outlined her proposals in a village letter which the wider Newsletter team quickly circulated in Tarves village before actual lockdown. Offers of help came swiftly, volunteer areas were identified, donation points were established in the SPAR and the Pharmacy - and so this project began. Tarves Church was awarded a share of the Scottish Government Resilience Fund and further financial help came from Aberdeenshire Council's Community Resilience Fund via a bid from the Community Council and Tarves People's Party. This was further supplemented by the SPAR organisation in the form of vouchers to be used in the village shop. Meldrum Rotary also contributed to the project, plus various personal donations, all welcomed and carefully documented. A big 'thank you' to those who donated, and continue to donate, food/toiletries in the collection trolleys in the SPAR and the Pharmacy; these provided the first few dozen bags before the funding monies arrived. Alison liaised with Mrs Conn in Tarves School, and some of the pupils created eye catching flyers to add to the bags. These were colourful and warmly worded – a personal message to everyone. A few children went on to contribute to the June TBC with letters on their springtime lockdown experiences, with one letter as a 'guest editor' spot.

Our first 'gift bags' were delivered on Wednesday 25 March and have since continued on a regular basis. At the date of writing (20 August), we had delivered 385 bags with contents carefully chosen according to the recipient's specific circumstances, complete with the cheerful flyers and a little note inside with phone contact details for further help. The unexpected ring of a doorbell came with a hello, with a gift and contents chosen especially for them, as a message to people that the Church and community were thinking about them. There was a special bag for NHS workers in the village with thanks for their dedication to patients. A few people in the village experienced some ill-health during lockdown too, and a bag with some chocolates, cake and tea/coffee was always welcomed.

Volunteers covered all age groups from teenagers onwards, each willing to help, even those who were still working offered help when their shift was finished. This led to both initiatives being nominated by the local Community Council for the Aberdeenshire Voluntary Action Community Spirit Award, then going on to win these awards from AVA. So, to all volunteers whether part of the 'Grass Cutters', the Church project or individually helping friends and neighbours, these awards are for you. We have had so many thank you cards, phone calls and messages recently, all with the clear message of 'thank you', so please carry on being generous with your time, being kind in your actions and being thoughtful to others

The Care in the Tarves Community project will still continue but on a lesser scale. However, we intend to help families on a monthly basis and also during school holiday time, so please keep donating in the local shops. Dear Friends

A few weeks ago we discovered a nest of sparrows in the outlet of the cooker hood in the manse kitchen. Unfortunately one of the birds had actually found its way down into the hood itself rather than out into the fresh air. We could hear its wings beating. Sean did not feel he could take the cooker hood apart himself – or rather he could have taken it apart, but getting it together again would have been a different story. So we had to call someone out to the manse to fix it. The tradesman was very busy but promised to come round as soon as he could.

From time to time we heard the bird fluttering around. Then there would be silence. The silence grew longer just before the kitchen man arrived. And we were sure that the bird had not survived. However when the cooker hood was opened up, we discovered that the bird had flown! The mess was still there but the bird had found its way out to freedom.

If going into lock down was difficult, then this period during which we are trying to come out of it again, holds its own challenges. Those challenges are particularly acute for any who have been kept shielded. Most of us have had the opportunity to get used to a changed world more gradually and a little bit at a time. Even then, if we are honest many of us still find shopping a stressful experience, or at least I do – remembering to take my face covering with me is the least of it!

But for those who have been kept shielded, moving out into the world is a huge step. Suddenly the freedom we thought we longed for does not look so inviting after all. No matter how much we may have craved freedom from the restrictions that were placed upon us, most of us have found it very strange to be out and about once more. Of course the freedom we yearned for during lock down is not the one we enjoy now. Unlike the sparrow which managed to find its way out of the cooker hood into the freedom of its natural environment, we are still living in an unnatural state. The coronavirus is still with us. We are still having to physically distance which is not something that comes naturally to us. And as I write this there are still no gyms or swimming pools open and face coverings have become a regular feature of life.

As far as the Church is concerned, the reopening of our buildings has been fenced around with so many conditions that the Kirk Sessions in both Barthol Chapel and Tarves believe we can offer a better experience of worship on-line or on the telephone for those who do not have the technology. On-line there is no restriction on the numbers who can join in; we can sing our faith together in the freedom of our homes; we can chat together after the service in small groups; and we don't have to wear face coverings – we can see each other.

This freedom seems to be much more in tune with the freedom of which the Christian faith talks. In the bible we find these words "where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom". (2 Cor 3:17) That freedom is the freedom from fear which God's love promises whatever our circumstances. It is a freedom which we can enjoy and celebrate in spite of the physical restrictions that continue to feature in our lives.

All that having been said, there may be other good reasons for our churches or hall to open and we are continually keeping this possibility under review. In the meantime on-line worship continues – if you would like to join us please contact me or one of the elders for the link to our Sunday service. If you are not sure about how to use Zoom please just ask – we will be happy to help – a few months ago none of us had heard of it –so we know how you feel – it really is an easy app to use! And if restrictions are eased sufficiently before this letter is printed then we would be absolutely delighted to welcome you to a service in Church. Check out the Church/community web-sites for up-to-date information.

The path to nowhere - the reason why......

There's been much comment and curiosity over the new path alongside the Glebe field. It had originally been planned as part of a larger Government funded scheme to provide a path from Tarves to the Prop, but unfortunately this could not be fulfilled.

However, it was felt that the path could still form part of a meaningful project for the benefit of our community, although it had to be kept confidential until certain consents had been obtained, and has been yet further delayed by Covid 19.

The Glebe is owned by the Kirk, and income from its let helps with Church costs. To make it more attractive to tenants, it was decided that a new stock fence was necessary. If the new fence was to be brought 10 feet into the field, a perimeter path could be created, linking the new path round the field, to the existing dog walk

About a kilometre in length, it will hopefully provide a useful and enjoyable path of a decent length, while keeping animals safe on both sides of the new stock fence.

It will be a grass path, similar to the dog walk, so the more it's used, the better it will become!

Thanks are due to Chris and Tamsin for their work on the roadside path, along with the Heritage Centre/Kirk in cooperation on the project. For the perimeter path, thanks are due to the Kirk for giving use of the ground and fencing off.

Click and Collect and Doorstep Deliveries bring local libraries closer to you

Click and Collect and Doorstep Deliveries are now available in Oldmeldrum (HQ in Meldrum Meg Way, NOT the public library at the Academy), Ellon, Fraserburgh, Banchory, Ballater and Stonehaven.

People have so far been jumping at the chance to collect (or have delivered) new books, hearing aid batteries from the NHS and Curricular Support Resources.

Some new services have been added to Click and Collect at Library HQ in Oldmeldrum. Customers will be able to book a slot to collect reading group collections as well as Bookbug Baby and Bookbug Toddler bags. Photocopying will also be added to the booking system where a member of staff will carry out the photocopying on your behalf. Customers can either book a slot for this service or add it onto a drop off or collection booking.

While Live Life Aberdeenshire's digital library services have been very well used during lockdown, there has been great demand for increased access to materials only available in libraries.

The new services are being introduced to allow customers and staff to remain socially distant and safe, while still getting what they need to make lockdown more bearable.

A new online system has been developed alongside an easy-to-use phone service to book time slots and resources. A "Live Chat" function is also available on the Live Life Aberdeenshire website. Customers can return items to any of the participating sites.

We hope you are all well and starting to enjoy the new norm. Aren't children amazing in how resilient they are! We should all take a leaf out of their book; love, live and laugh. We are all so very proud of the children in the community.

The Youth Hall is currently getting new flooring installed so playgroup will reopen when this is complete, we are very excited to see it all finished. This was also a job delayed by COVID!

We are in full swing getting ready for reopening, we have risk assessments and procedures all done and just being checked over before making them final, we want the children to have fun but keep everyone safe at the same time. Transition work is also taking place, we are working on some photo collages, poems and videos to send to our families so children can be a little more familiar with the staff before starting. I'm sure the children will love to see the staff's smiley faces again.

You may ask yourself, "What is the difference between **Playgroup** and **Nursery**"? The answer is they are **both the same**. They both follow the same Early Level Curriculum for Excellence, they both provide exciting learning opportunities, they both track children's progress through regular observations and monitoring, they both have robust risk assessments, policies and procedures, they both have highly trained staff or staff undertaking training and both have fantastic resources.

The only differences are that Playgroup is run by a voluntary parent led committee which is very rewarding to be part of and a great way of making friendships and we provide day care of children aged from 2 years.

We are in partnership with the local authority to provide **funded pre-school education** for children aged from **three to five years** and also have funded places for **eligible two year olds**. 
wonderful space for children to explore and learn. So much learning can take place outside while having fun but this has been spoilt due to idle hands!!



Ellon and District Men's Shed

The Ellon Men's Shed is coming out of lockdown and the trustees and members are looking for the Shed to get back in to operation. It will be quite a different operation with the Covid-19 controls in place for some time until we can get back to a more normal operation. The Men's Shed is going to be even more important to helping men's wellbeing after lockdown. It will be important to get men back in to the social environment and activity areas the Shed provides. The trustees work load is going to be much greater in order to ensure that the Covid-19 controls being put in place are maintained to ensure everyone is safe. If you feel that you would like to help the trustees and enjoy the Men's Shed banter, then please follow our website for Shed reopening progress and get in touch.

Through gallant efforts by the dedicated trustees, the garden area has been maintained to perfection with grass cutting, strimming, hedge cutting and weeding and we greatly thank the trustees involved. The 540 plug plants delivered at lockdown have mainly survived with the planting out and care by trustees and members.

The painting team have spruced up the workshop, social area, hall, and toilets with emulsion paint to make the Shed ready for re-opening and a big *thank you* is also due here.

Shed members have been borrowing tools and portable equipment to help with their home projects to keep themselves busy.

A further review of the Ellon Men's Shed finances was required when it was realised that Covid-19 controls were going to be in place for much longer than previously expected and that we would be lucky to have our funding streams back to normal before the end of 2021.

The Scottish Government 'Small Business' grant scheme administered by Aberdeenshire Council has come to our aid to ensure our Shed resilience and we thank them.

Formartine Rural Partnership have also awarded the Shed £500 to help with our polytunnel project and for which we are very grateful.

The plan to get the Shed back in operation has been made, and consists of a Covid-19 risk assessment which identifies the controls to be put in place to protect our trustees and members, along with other visitors to the Shed. Hand washing, sanitising, hygiene, PPE, social distancing and attendee numbers are the main areas of the Covid-19 controls. Member guidelines will also be issued so that visits to the Shed can be enjoyed safely.
