Editor's letter - time just to simply listen?

The past 8 months have given us time which we would have used up in 'normal' circumstances – how we've used it is unique to each person – but what about taking some of that time **just to simply listen**.

Think about it, we switch on TV, we watch the news, we have conversations with friends but how often do we actually listen? TV is too easy, one eye on a programme while doing something else at the same time, so listening is cast aside. I've always been a radio listener but over the last 6/7 months I have discovered podcasts. There is no visual experience here – just the listener and the sound of another voice bringing you into their world. Podcasts cover a huge spectrum of interests from culture to health to sport to travel and much more. They can last from 30 minutes or a number of episodes making up a whole novel. Concentration is dedicated to the sound of an engaging voice, and no distraction of backdrops encourages a 'one to one' listening exercise. The skills in producing podcasts are considerable, the voice has to be one which welcomes and immerses you in the story, one which you would love to listen to again, and can often lead to an interest in a subject which you've never explored before.

There are podcasts on simple scientific discoveries, written and read with such skill as to create further investigation; podcasts on politics with either serious discussion or so light hearted it reduces the Covid-19 situation to a manageable one; various history podcasts where 30 minutes of well-constructed narrative can give the listener a good basic outline of a topic; biographies of known and lesser known figures.

Last week, I listened to a travel journalist describing his train journey from Cusco to Machu Picchu Pueblo, which is the town closest to the Lost City of the Incas, Machu Picchu in Peru only discovered until 1911. Of course, that set off an internet trail of finding more information about the discovery and the history behind the structure.

bbc.co.uk/sounds is a good starter point for finding podcasts – there are many which related to our present circumstances; you'll find 30 + minute compilations such as 'Mindful Mix', entirely relaxing music chosen for specific times of the day, you'll also find calming words helping you make some sense of present life.

Listen to family, friends, neighbours and even those who you don't know so well

Listening can be likened to word-to-word resuscitation, which might just save yours, and others' day

I'd like finish with thanks to all contributors throughout 2020 for their time and preparation of articles. They brought a sense of 'continuing' rather than a 'halt' when lockdown came earlier this year. Organisations adapted their activities to work with the limitations placed upon everyone.

Similarly, to our advertisers – your presence in our pages ensures the presence of the TBC in our Parish. 1,000 copies of TBC are printed each quarter and shared across a wide area – and I would encourage all readers to become familiar with services, shops and tradesmen available to them.

In all weathers, the TBC distributors deliver your copy of the newsletter – a big thank you to them for their commitment. This is possibly the last TBC to be published locally as Catriona in Pitmedden is taking 'printer leave', she has always accommodated our printing schedules cheerfully, as well as having many other commitments in her own diary.

The TBC team who typeset, check diary dates (next year maybe!), and look after the finances are quite simply - the **best**.

Dear Friends

It is "always winter and never Christmas". Those were words used by C S Lewis in his book "the Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" to describe the imaginary land of Narnia. I'm sure most of you are familiar with the Narnia Chronicles. When the Pevensie children are first transported to Narnia the snow is falling and everything looks beautiful. However, when they meet the faun, Mr Tumnus, he explains that, although Narnia may look beautiful, covered as it is in snow and ice, the reality is very different. Because the White Witch controls Narnia, it is "always winter and never Christmas". As the story continues, the power of the White Witch is challenged and ebbs away and eventually the sun returns to the land of Narnia bringing with it, better times.

However, nothing can change the ultimate significance of the message that lies at the heart of Christmas – that the God of love has entered our world and promises to be with us through good times and more challenging days. And so, we might say, "It is always Christmas even when it is winter!"



We have missed working with you this year and pray that next year we will be able to meet up and have some fun once again.



These will be shared via Social Work departments throughout the shire.

Local babies have also benefitted from your knitting – there have been a few babies born over the last 6 months and some knitting has been passed to them, emphasising that they have all been knitted locally and the knitters are happy that babies in the Parish will benefit.

Here is a record of how donations were shared from January – end October 2020:



Malawi – 6 well packed boxes were sent out in February 2020, with blankets, hat and scarf sets, skirts, teddies, hat and jumper sets.

Woodend Hospital was given 15 knee blankets at the beginning of this year, but they can't take any more donations at the present time.

Special Care Baby Unit – August – November 2020 - 510 hats, 25 baby cardigans and 42

blankets. Plus 60 assorted knitted mini Christmas puddings and red Christmas hats which will be fitted with a Terry's chocolate orange, and then sold for SCBU fundraising.



Seafarers Centre, Aberdeen - was given 30 larger hats, scarves and neck-warmers to help those seamen who have to stay in Aberdeen until they are able travel back to their own countries

Romania Appeal – to go out in November 2020. 225 hat and scarf sets, 110 hat and vest sets, 30 teddies and 40 blankets.

Cosy bosies for Aberdeenshire Council – 20 knee blankets, 8 twiddle-muffs and 5 larger size hats, were handed into Library HQ in Meldrum at the end of October.

Every piece of knitting means a personal gift from the knitters to babies/children/adults we won't know, but please be assured that they are so welcome, both in Grampian and overseas.

Attack on Glebe field sheep

On Wednesday 18 November, one of the sheep in the Glebe field was fatally attacked during daylight hours.

Whilst no witnesses have yet come forward at time of writing, investigation by the stockholder's Vet subsequent to this horrible incident, has established that given the nature and extent of injury to the poor beast, the attack was not carried out by a fox or badger. In the absence of any witnesses, all that can be confirmed is that the sheep was killed by a "substantial" animal.

Police have been informed, the Vet's report forwarded, and the stockholder awaits developments.

It is most sad to have to report such an incident in Tarves, notable in the general way of things for its lack of upset and concern. As far as the newly created perimeter paths and the new tenancy of the Glebe field are concerned, the path is becoming well used, the sheep are happy meeting folk at the fence, all as it should be.

Walkers and dog walkers remain very welcome and are encouraged to use the paths for exercise and enjoyment. This does of necessity carry the condition that folk behave responsibly, and whilst there is livestock in the field, this includes keeping dogs under close control.



Ellon and District Men's Shed - December 2020

The Ellon and District Men's Shed has continued to maintain the Shed facility

and garden in good condition. See garden photographs.

Now with an approved Covid-19 risk assessment and corresponding control measures in place, we partially reopened our Shed to members in November, although in a very restricted way to ensure all are kept Covid-19 safe. We have started with very limited numbers of men (6 at any one time) and activities are confined to maintenance / repair of the Shed and garden. We cannot undertake 'hobby' type activities at this time. The social area has a very restricted distanced layout and the kitchen facilities are closed.





The opening hours of 10am to 2pm on Mondays and Thursdays will be regularly reviewed.

We see this restricted Shed operation continuing for the foreseeable future although we must do our best for the wellbeing of men in our community.

Nevertheless, the current rota of 6 men attending on the open days is proving very enjoyable and all bring their own food and drink with them.

We have also continued with Shed administration and achieved a successful independent audit of the Shed financial accounts in October. Our Shed AGM was held on Zoom on 20th October and 3 new trustees were appointed. The audit of financial accounts and chairman's report were registered online with OSCR by the end of October.





But we couldn't have predicted this! How to keep motivated and resilient when uncertainty stretches ahead

We've heard time and again that we're living in unprecedented times. It explains a lot, and gives us comfort that we might not know exactly what to do. It gives us opportunities in some areas, and pause for thought in others. Some people are managing very well, and some aren't. But the problem with not having been able to foresee any of this is a bit of a red herring, because the thought renders us a bit powerless. It doesn't matter what others are doing, it matters that you have strategies in place to notice when you're feeling less on top of things, and know when to put these strategies to good use.

The exercise below is especially useful if you're tempted to compare yourself to someone else – someone you believe to be coping better, more successful or productive, better at home schooling, diet and exercise, I could go on, but I won't! I want you to feel better, not worse...

So, whenever you're tempted to compare yourself to someone else, resist the temptation.

Instead, compare yourself to who you were five years ago.

Only you know what you've achieved in the last five years. I encourage you to write it all down. Here's an example from me.

In the last five years I have:

- · given birth for the second time
- · looked after a newborn and a toddler
- returned to work
- questioned everything
- · been promoted
- · questioned everything
- · put my head above the parapet






