Dear All Saints,


Recently a colleague's son tragically died. He had been struggling a long time with mental health, so I thought I would say a few words about what 'ADHD' looks like in adults. Medically, ADHD is caused by a poorly functioning 'pre-frontal cortex', the part that does executive function. They often have over-active minds 'like washing-machines' and struggle with task management and time-keeping, and often seen as lazy procrastinators. Simply, the ADHD mind get distracted. It is easily bored in conversations, interjects inappropriately, doesn't filter what is said, often unthinkingly upsets others, then catastrophise and feels rejection very strongly. ADHD people often struggle with authority figures as they can't listen to or follow mindless instructions, they get impatient in queues, and only focus on things they are interested in. Relationally, people with ADHD can seem uncaring and insensitive because they struggle showing empathy (they will classically tell a similar story about themselves). They tend to live in the present and do things only when they really need to be done, ignoring other tasks. On the positive side, the over-active ADHD mind does function really well in exciting high intensity environments, like war zones, hospital emergency rooms, racing cars, or as stand-up comedians or live TV presenters.

ADHD people are often intelligent, but because they struggle to use their over-active minds to good effect, they tend to strongly feel shame, guilt and have low self-esteem. They are aware they are different, that their minds and emotions don't function quite as they should, but are not sure why, and blame themselves. They constantly tell themselves 'I must try harder'. In social situations they endlessly 'mask' themselves to fit in. Because of the constant guilt and shame many people with ADHD end up in our churches, seeking forgiveness, salvation and an accepting community.

As to causes, there is a genetic component. ADHD certainly tends to run in families. It also may have roots in trauma; when a child lives constantly in fight or flight mode, they remain hyper-aware of those around them, always vigilantly living in the moment, never learning to empathise, relate or relax. Adults diagnosed with ADHD in later life are often relieved that 'it's not their fault'. Self-understanding helps people with ADHD, as do normal healthy habits; exercise, good eating, good sleep, and focusing on organisation. Some chose medication and express afterwards how calm their mind now is, and are amazed they are able to focus on tasks without distraction.

Many of these 'ADHD' characteristics are commonplace to us all; it's when they are extreme they become an issue. We are all different, and however our brains work, self-knowledge, awareness and acceptance of difference in others, and toleration of each other is beneficial to us all.

May all our restless minds know the peace of Christ, Revd Ulric

BIBLE CROSSWORD XII - SOLUTION






