Luke 15: 1-10 - The Pharisees and scribes grumbled among themselves that Jesus welcomed the company of sinners. In the parable of the Prodigal and his Brother he showed them how all men are important to God. "...I tell you there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents." (v10)
