Brexit Day - Thursday 31 October - The Diocese of Bath and Wells have asked churches to be open for part of the day, in order for people to find a quiet space and to be able to pray. Therefore to accommodate this St Martin's Church will be open following the Thursday Holy Communion for people to use the church. Rev Gill Bunce has agreed to be available following the service, should anyone need to speak to her.

A new water boiler is situated in the kitchen for making teas and coffees. If you have previously used the old urn, please have a word with Paul, Carol or Gill Y. It is our intention, for our Sunday services, to continue using the flasks and there is ample room for these to be positioned underneath the tap. The water is 98° so extreme care is needed. The boiler will automatically refill.
