⁷ Our soul is escaped as a bird out of the snare of the fowlers: the snare is broken, and we are escaped.


⁸ Our help is in the name of the LORD, who made heaven and earth.

Living what we believe - Knowing Being Doing

I joined Northampton NTCG in 1960 when it met in Alfred Street School Hall. I remember how we had to take up the straw that the dogs slept on before we could use the hall. The 'pastor' at that time was one Bro Wooley, an English man who was a missionary and had recently returned from missions in the West Indies.

My husband and I used to share a house with a man who went to the missionary meetings led by Bro Wooley. One Sunday evening, I decided to go along with him to the meeting. Bro Wooley had just come back from the West Indies and he was pleased to see us attend his meeting.

One day, Bro Casely, from the Rugby NTCG, called at the house I was living in whilst he was making 'house calls' to spread the gospel and establish a NTCG congregation in Northampton. I went along to the service to which he invited me and in 1961, became the first member of NTCG in Northampton. Not long afterwards others joined. Some, such as the late Sis Liburd, the late Bro Heath, Sis Heath, Bro & Sis Spence who came from the Rugby NTCG, some were already Christians but attending other churches such as the late Sis Brown, Bro & the late Sis Cleghorn (not the current Sis Cleghorn), the late Bro Casely & Sis Casely who now lives in Leicester and others who became Christians as a result of our evangelistic efforts. As our children were born the Church became engaged in wider ministries through its liturgy and other child/youth related activities. My daughter Valerie, was the first baby to be dedicated in the Northampton NTCG.

Later on, we moved from Vernon Terrace to Victoria Road and from Victoria Road and under the leadership of the late Rev Eric Bailey we moved to Barry Road which was a bigger building. Our Sunday School grew with mainly children from the black community albeit their parents didn't come to church. We also extended our times of meeting and held a morning and an evening service on Sundays.

In 1969 Rev & Sis R Parkinson replaced Rev Bailey as the local minister. By this time we were meeting as a gathered community and extended our times of meeting to accommodate Young People for Christ (YPFC) on a

Wednesday/Thursday evenings, ladies meeting on Wednesday evenings led by Sis Parkinson who taught the ladies handicrafts and how to make several things. Prayer meetings were held on Wednesdays. All of these services were held to help everyone to grow in our Christian faith. Fund raising activities such as Jumble Sales and sponsored walks, were also organised mainly by the young people to raise money to buy our own church building. A lot of money was raised over the years, and as a result today we have our own building here at College Street as an outcome of our hard work, commitment and resilience.

Looking back to those early years in comparison to now, I would say that the brethren were closer, we were more like a family. I miss that sense of 'togetherness'. I also miss the brethren who were there during those early years. I think there is a tendency now for something almost like a tier system in our church where some members are seen to be at the top, some move around in cliques and others appear to be in a lower and excluded group. I hope and pray that this does not become a reality.

I am not able to attend College St at this time due to the Covid-19 challenges. I'm staying with my daughter and go to the church where she does in Leicester or I stay at home and listen to a service in Oxford via YouTube or we go to Oxford. However, I am still in touch with some of the College St brethren, some come to see me in Leicester and I receive copies of the News Bulletin to keep me further updated.

We have come a long way. Our current ministers have been to college and university and so they are highly educated. I hope though that we will never be so 'highly educated' that we fail to take wise counsel from Spirit-led believers as the Lord leads.




