First of all, we would like to thank all of you who responded to our last appeal to increase your weekly/monthly offerings to the church and those who contributed in the Gift Weekend, last October. It is very much appreciated.

A big thank you is due to our Fund Raising Committee and to those of you who support their events. All of this is beginning to make a difference.

However, with increasing costs, especially salaries and fuel costs, our givings are not covering our running costs. We have been trying to control costs as much as possible, but we have been running a deficit for many months now and have had to dig into our reserves to cover this. We are fast approaching the day when we will be unable to cover our expenses as our reserves will run out.

The only long-term solution is to increase our offerings substantially. Many of us have not increased our givings for a long time or even increased them in line with inflation. Although financially, times can be difficult for us, please consider increasing your offering by whatever you can afford.

# SPECIAL VISITORS...

You may, or may not(!) know that our striking window above the communion table, the one we all look to every week, is our Mactaggart Memorial window. The window was unveiled and dedicated on November 20th, 1932. The inscription at the foot of the window reads "To the Glory of God, And in loving memory of Margaret Lockhart Mactaggart, Died 14th May, 1927, Joint owner of King's Park Estate" The window was a gift from J.A. Mactaggart, in memory of his late wife.

On the 4th of October 1959, two further windows, the ones above the main front doors of the church, were gifted to the church by the Mactaggart family and dedicated on Sunday 4th October in memory of J.A. Mactaggart and Margaret



Lockhart Mactaggart's son, Sir John Auld Mactaggart and his wife, Lady Lena Mactaggart.

The Mactaggart family hold a very special place in the hearts of all at King's Park and so we were thrilled when the family visited us from their home in New York last summer!

The photograph above shows Philip Mactaggart (*left*) **great grandson** of J.A. Mactaggart and Margaret Lockhart Mactaggart, and Ian Mactaggart (*middle*) **great great grandson** of J.A. Mactaggart and Margaret Lockhart with his partner Danielle. It was such a joy to welcome them on their whistle stop tour of the sanctuary and reassure them that our beautiful windows are looking as resplendent as they did 93 years and 66 years ago respectively.

Just return it to the church at your convenience. We will also have some church collection envelopes available to those attending worship in the church on Sunday 11 May, the Christian Aid Week launch.

If you're not "on-line" and can't get to that service, for whatever reason, or are unable to return your collection envelope, you can also donate to Christian Aid by sending a cheque, made payable to "Christian Aid", at the church address (on the front page of this magazine) and mark it 'CAW' on the front of the envelope. In addition, if you are a UK taxpayer, please confirm this on the back of your cheque with a note of your name and address - this will allow Christian Aid to reclaim tax from the Government, thereby increasing your donation by 25%.

There are plans for various other associated events – CA lunch on the 11th May and a CA quiz on 16th May, and maybe some surprises! – keep an eye on the church intimations, Facebook etc for further details This Christian Aid Week, with your help, we can work towards a world where families can escape the trap of poverty and fulfil their ambitions. Seven days, so many ways to fund lasting change. Please give generously.

#### Let Glasgow Flourish Award

Some of you may remember recently that, on behalf of the Incorporation of Gardeners of Glasgow, King's Park Church was judged as a bronze award winner in their annual "Let Glasgow Flourish" awards.

The Incorporation of Gardeners of Glasgow is one of the fourteen ancient craft guilds of Glasgow. First established around 1605, as an organisation to protect the craft of gardeners of the time, it has operated solely as a charity since 1846. Established in 1983, the awards recognise the contribution made to the City of Glasgow by businesses, charities and other organisations who maintain floral or horticultural displays outside their venues. They believe that by maintaining floral or similar displays, organisations, such as King's Park Church, make Glasgow a better place in which to live and work. While at this time, we acknowledge the dedicated work of all our gardeners, past and present, sadly we were given only two tickets to attend the ceremony at the Trades Hall. Those tickets aptly went to our incredibly long serving gardeners, Robert and Isabel Packer, who collected the award from the Lord Provost, on behalf of us all, as seen below.
