

What started in 2016 as an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to the Church of England has grown into an international and ecumenical call to prayer.

Llisbury will be taking part along with churches and Christians from over 85 countries. You are all encouraged to commit to pray for 5 of your non-Christian family or friends each day from Thursday 30th May until Sunday 9th June. This month Chris has reminded us of the importance of the part prayer has in creating opportunities for sharing the good news of Jesus.

To help focus our prayers there will be booklets available in the coming weeks to help us record our thoughts and answers to prayer.
