

What is a deanery?

Within the Church of England, a deanery is a significant midpoint between the parish and the whole diocese. It is not primarily about the deanery synod, although this is important.

As we become more healthy and sustainable, we will need to work together effectively at a level that is more local than the diocese, but which enables greater collaboration and joined up working than is possible solely within a parish. It makes no sense for parishes or benefices to function completely independently of one another in a world which is more relational and networked than ever before.
