Calling Young Disciples

The Calling Young Disciples (CYD) Project will come to an end in July next year. The project aimed to see a significant and sustained increase in the capacity of churches to engage with children and young people - so they respond to God's call to be disciples of Jesus.

CYD, which began in 2017, was 40% funded by the Church Commissioners as a time-limited project. Some of the project team will finish at the end of November with two Mission Enablers, Helen Laird and Sian Morgan, continuing until July to do some specific work with parishes where there is potential to reach a greater number of children, young people and families.

Earlier in November an event was held to celebrate all that has been achieved, say thank you to those involved, hear about the Church of England's national vision and outline the support for children and youth work going forward – including launching a new suite of resources to help parishes with children and youth work in their churches.

Fuel Poverty Awareness Day (Friday 2 Dec)

Fuel poverty* has been highlighted recently due to the growing cost of fuel. But other factors include the energy efficiency of buildings and the level of income of each household. It is estimated that one in three households in the UK – some 8.2 million – will experience fuel poverty this winter.

That those least able to afford fuel also live in homes which are the most expensive and difficult to heat compounds the problem and highlights the injustice of the situation.

The impact is more than not being warm. Fuel poverty leads to households taking on unsustainable levels of debt, resulting in a vicious cycle that that can be difficult to break. The health of those living in cold homes suffers, and as household budgets are squeezed there is not enough to buy food, a particular problem for households with children.

Our Gospel for today (Matthew 3:1-12) introduces us to John the Baptist and his call to repentance before the coming of God's salvation through Christ. He had particularly harsh words for the Pharisees and Sadducees, challenging them to produce fruit in keeping with repentance. We are reminded that issues such as fuel poverty are not just somebody else's problem.

*Fuel poverty is defined as anyone living in a property with an energy efficiency rating of band D or below, and where to heat their home to 21°C in the main living space would leave residual income below the official poverty line.

St Wulfstan Cross

St Wulfstan's feast day is on 19 January and each year, the Cross of St Wulfstan is awarded to individuals who have made an outstanding contribution to the life of the Church in our diocese. St. Wulfstan/Wulstan lived c. 1008 - 1095. He served as Bishop of Worcester under the last two Saxon kings and the first two Norman kings. After the Norman Conquest he was responsible for the



dismantling of the old Saxon cathedral and the building of a new one, of which the crypt is the main part still surviving today. He was at once venerated as a saint by the people of Worcester, though he was not formally canonized until 1203. Alongside the tomb of St. Oswald, his shrine was a place of pilgrimage until the Reformation. Wulfstan found a special place in local people's affections. He even preached against the slave trade in Bristol, then part of his Diocese, and thankfully managed to end this practise for a long while.

Fair Trade Fortnight

Fairtrade Fortnight runs from 21 February to 6 March and is run by the Fairtrade Foundation. We are all familiar with the Fairtrade mark, Fairtrade coffee, crafts and an increasing range of many other products. The Fairtrade Premium – the extra payment to producers that can fund all manner of local community initiatives, from clean water to education and

employment opportunities – is a very real way that our consumption can make a material difference to poor producers on the other side of the world.

Being a Fairtrade Church and running a Fairtrade stall is one important step we can all take. But Fairtrade is also about the way our global economy works, making our markets accessible to producers from poorer nations. In early 2023 the UK government introduced the Developing Countries Trading Scheme (DCTS) which seeks to lower or remove tariffs on a wider range of products from low-income countries, a step welcomed by the Fairtrade Foundation. The scheme also promotes best practices by linking membership of the scheme to compliance with international agreements on the environment and climate.
